A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Chapter 7 of Title 50 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to the
- 2 Department of Economic Development, so as to create the Legislative Economic
- 3 Development Council; to provide for legislative declarations; to provide for definitions; to
- 4 provide for the council's duties; to provide for the council's powers; to provide for the
- 5 council's membership; to provide for an annual report; to provide for related matters; to
- 6 repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

8 SECTION 1.

- 9 Chapter 7 of Title 50 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to the Department
- 10 of Economic Development, is amended by adding a new article to read as follows:
- 11 <u>"ARTICLE 8</u>
- 12 50-7-90.
- 13 The General Assembly declares that the legislative branch needs a forum to evaluate the
- state's overall economic development strategy and review all state funded activities and
- 15 <u>expenditures that go into implementing such strategy.</u>
- 16 <u>50-7-91.</u>
- 17 There is created the Legislative Economic Development Council whose purpose shall be
- 18 to evaluate the state's overall economic development strategy and to oversee the
- 19 <u>effectiveness of such strategy during its implementation.</u>
- 20 <u>50-7-92.</u>
- 21 (a) As used in this article, the term 'council' means the Legislative Economic Development
- 22 <u>Council created pursuant to Code Section 50-7-91.</u>

- 23 (b) The duties of the council shall include:
- 24 (1) To review the state's current strategic goals regarding economic development, job
- 25 <u>creation, and business formation and retention in Georgia and review its progress towards</u>
- 26 <u>meeting such goals</u>;
- 27 (2) To review the Department of Economic Development's annual activities and
- 28 expenditures and how they work to advance the state's overall strategic vision for
- 29 <u>economic development;</u>
- 30 (3) To review the mission and performance of the economic development funds and
- 31 programs that the state provides resources for and how they work to advance the state's
- 32 <u>overall strategic vision for economic development. Such programs may include, but are</u>
- 33 <u>not limited to, programs administered by the Department of Community Affairs,</u>
- 34 <u>OneGeorgia programs, the Georgia Research Alliance, and all state funded or supported</u>
- 35 economic development programs within the University System of Georgia;
- 36 (4) To periodically review current tax exemptions and credits;
- 37 (5) To analyze legislative proposals regarding economic development and make
- 38 <u>recommendations to appropriate legislative committees for action;</u>
- 39 (6) To study the budgets, programs, and policies of state or local governing entities
- 40 <u>involved in economic development;</u>
- 41 (7) To analyze legislation and policies from other states regarding economic
- 42 <u>development; and</u>
- 43 (8) To review the laws of this state and the laws, policies, procedures, and guidelines of
- 44 this state's agencies to identify existing barriers to job creation and economic
- 45 <u>development.</u>
- 46 (c) The council shall meet at least twice during each calendar year. Additional meetings
- 47 <u>may be held upon the call of the chairperson or upon the call of a majority of the members</u>
- of the council. Eight members of the council shall constitute a quorum and the affirmative
- 49 <u>vote of a majority of those members present at a meeting of the council, provided such</u>
- 50 members present constitute a quorum, shall be necessary to transact business of the council.
- 51 The chairperson shall be entitled to vote on all matters requiring a vote of the council.
- 52 <u>50-7-93.</u>
- 53 The council shall have the power to:
- 54 (1) Meet at such times and places as it may deem necessary;
- 55 (2) Cooperate with and secure the cooperation of every department, agency, or
- 56 <u>instrumentality in the state government or its political subdivisions in the furtherance of</u>
- 57 <u>the purposes of this article;</u>

58 (3) Employ such staff as the council deems necessary to carry out the powers delegated

- 59 <u>to the council by this article;</u>
- 60 (4) Appoint a citizens advisory committee to be made up of business and industry leaders
- 61 <u>to provide input and guidance to the council;</u>
- 62 (5) Adopt such rules and regulations as are necessary to carry out the purposes of this
- 63 <u>article; and</u>
- 64 (6) Do any and all things necessary or convenient to enable it to perform wholly and
- adequately its duties and to exercise the power granted to it.
- 66 <u>50-7-94.</u>
- 67 The council shall be cochaired by the Lieutenant Governor and the Speaker of the House
- of Representatives. The Lieutenant Governor shall chair the council meetings in the first
- 69 year upon the effectiveness of this Act. Thereafter, the Lieutenant Governor and the
- 70 Speaker shall alternate years chairing the council meetings. The council shall consist of:
- 71 (1) The chairperson of the Senate Appropriations Committee;
- 72 (2) The chairperson of the Senate Economic Development Committee;
- 73 (3) The chairperson of the Senate Finance Committee;
- 74 (4) The chairperson of the Senate Higher Education Committee;
- 75 (5) A member of the Senate to be appointed by the minority leader of the Senate;
- 76 (6) A member of the Senate to be appointed by the Lieutenant Governor:
- 77 (7) The chairperson of the House Committee on Appropriations;
- 78 (8) The chairperson of the House Committee on Economic Development and Tourism;
- 79 (9) The chairperson of the House Committee on Ways and Means;
- 80 (10) The chairperson of the House Committee on Small Business and Job Creation;
- 81 (11) The chairperson of the House Committee on Higher Education; and
- 82 (12) A member of the House of Representatives appointed by the minority leader of the
- 83 <u>House of Representatives.</u>
- 84 <u>50-7-95.</u>
- 85 The Department of Economic Development shall prepare a report on an annual basis
- 86 detailing the state's programs and activities related to job creation and economic
- 87 <u>development in Georgia during the prior fiscal year. Such report shall list all the tools and</u>
- incentives that the state uses and how they were used during the prior year to grow jobs and
- 89 to recruit and retain business. With respect to tax credits, the report shall, to the greatest
- 90 extent possible, detail how much of each credit was used and how many jobs were created
- 91 <u>as a result of such credit. The report shall be submitted to each member of the council and</u>
- 92 <u>to the office of the Governor. The Department of Economic Development shall prepare</u>

93 <u>the report required pursuant to this Code section, which shall be completed no later than</u>

94 July 31 of each year."

95 SECTION 2.

96 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
