A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Article 2 of Chapter 20 of Title 45 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
- 2 relating to leaves of absence, so as to define a certain term; to provide that the spouse of any
- 3 member of the armed forces who was wounded in combat and who returns to this state shall
- 4 be entitled to 30 days of personal leave with pay and an additional 30 days of leave without
- 5 pay; to provide an effective date; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

7 SECTION 1.

- 8 Article 2 of Chapter 20 of Title 45 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 9 leaves of absence, is amended by adding a new Code section to read as follows:
- 10 "<u>45-20-32.</u>
- 11 (a) As used in this Code section, the term 'combat disabled military member' means a
- member of the armed forces who has been granted a permanent disability retirement or
- who has been placed on the temporary disability retirement list maintained by a branch of
- service because of wounds or injuries incurred in combat.
- 15 (b) Any state employee who is the spouse of a combat disabled military member shall be
- entitled to 30 days of personal leave with pay. Such period shall begin not later than the
- 17 <u>second month after such combat disabled military member's return to this state. Upon the</u>
- expiration of such period, such state employee shall be entitled to an additional 30 days of
- 19 <u>unpaid leave.</u>
- 20 (c) The State Personnel Board shall establish rules and regulations implementing the
- 21 provisions of this Code section."
- SECTION 2.
- 23 This Act shall become effective on the first day of the month following the month in which
- 24 it is approved by the Governor or in which it becomes law without such approval.

25 SECTION 3.

All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
