

Senate Bill 397

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
AN ACT

1 To amend Article 8 of Chapter 3 of Title 35 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
2 relating to the alert system for unapprehended murder and rape suspects under the
3 administration of the Georgia Bureau of Investigation, so as to create a state-wide "Blue
4 Alert" system to speed the apprehension of violent criminals who kill or seriously injure
5 local, state, or federal law enforcement officers; to provide for definitions; to provide for
6 procedure; to provide for related matters; to provide an effective date; to repeal conflicting
7 laws; and for other purposes.

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

9 style="text-align:center">**SECTION 1.**

10 Article 8 of Chapter 3 of Title 35 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to the
11 alert system for unapprehended murder and rape suspects under the administration of the
12 Georgia Bureau of Investigation, is amended by adding a new Code section to read as
13 follows:

14 "35-3-191.

15 (a) There is established a state-wide alert system known as 'Blue Alert' which shall be
16 developed and implemented by the director.

17 (b) As used in this Code section, the term:

18 (1) 'Law enforcement agency' means a law enforcement agency with jurisdiction over
19 the search for a suspect in a case involving the death or serious injury of a peace officer.

20 (2) 'Peace Officer' means a person who is certified by the Georgia Peace Officers and
21 Standards Council to exercise the powers of arrest.

22 (c) The 'Blue Alert' system may be activated when a suspect for a crime involving the
23 death or serious injury of a peace officer has not been apprehended, and law enforcement
24 personnel have determined that the suspect may be a serious threat to the public.

25 (d) The provisions of Code Sections 35-3-173, 35-3-175, and 35-3-178 shall also apply to
26 'Blue Alert' as set forth in this Code section.

27 (e) Upon notification by a law enforcement agency that a suspect in a case involving the
28 death or serious injury of a peace officer has not been apprehended and may be a serious
29 threat to the public, the director shall activate the 'Blue Alert' system and notify appropriate
30 participants in the 'Blue Alert' system, as established by rule, if:

31 (1) A law enforcement agency believes that a suspect has not been apprehended;

32 (2) A law enforcement agency believes that the suspect may be a serious threat to the
33 public; and

34 (3) Sufficient information is available to disseminate to the public that could assist in
35 locating the suspect.

36 The area of the alert may be less than state wide if the director determines that the nature
37 of the event makes it probable that the suspect did not leave a certain geographic location.

38 (f) Before requesting activation of the 'Blue Alert' system, a law enforcement agency shall
39 verify that the criteria described by subsection (e) of this Code section have been satisfied.

40 The law enforcement agency shall assess the appropriate boundaries of the alert based on
41 the nature of the suspect and the circumstances surrounding the crime.

42 (g) The director shall terminate any activation of the 'Blue Alert' system with respect to
43 a particular suspect if:

44 (1) The suspect is located or the incident is otherwise resolved; or

45 (2) The director determines that the 'Blue Alert' system is no longer an effective tool for
46 locating the suspect.

47 (h) Any entity or individual involved in the dissemination of a 'Blue Alert' generated
48 pursuant to this Code section shall not be liable for any civil damages arising from such
49 dissemination."

50 **SECTION 2.**

51 This Act shall become effective on July 1, 2010.

52 **SECTION 3.**

53 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
