

House Bill 49

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
AN ACT

1 To amend Article 2 of Chapter 4 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
2 relating to technical and adult education, so as to change the name of the State Board of
3 Technical and Adult Education to the State Board of the Technical College System of
4 Georgia; to amend various provisions of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated to change
5 references to reflect such name change; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting
6 laws; and for other purposes.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

8 **SECTION 1.**

9 Article 2 of Chapter 4 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
10 technical and adult education, is amended by revising Code Section 20-4-10, relating to the
11 establishment of the State Board of Technical and Adult Education, as follows:

12 "20-4-10.

13 (a) There is established a the State Board of the Technical College System of Georgia,
14 formerly known as the State Board of Technical and Adult Education, consisting of not
15 fewer than one member from each congressional district and nine at-large members who
16 shall be appointed by the Governor and confirmed by the Senate for five-year terms. Board
17 members in office on June 30, 2000, shall serve out the remainder of their respective terms.
18 Upon expiration of those terms, the Governor shall appoint seven successors to two-year
19 terms, six successors to three-year terms, and six successors to five-year terms. All
20 subsequent appointments shall be for regular five-year terms. Members shall represent
21 business, industry, or economic development. The board shall elect from its members a
22 chairperson, vice chairperson, and such other officers as are considered necessary, each to
23 serve for two-year terms. Officers may be elected to succeed themselves. Members shall
24 serve until their successors are appointed; however, in the event of a vacancy on the board
25 because of death, resignation, or removal for any reason other than expiration of a

26 member's term, the Governor shall fill such vacancy in the same manner as the original
 27 appointment and the person so appointed shall serve for the unexpired term of office.

28 (b) As used in this article, the term 'state board' means the State Board of ~~Technical and~~
 29 ~~Adult Education~~ the Technical College System of Georgia."

30 **SECTION 2.**

31 Code Section 20-16-2 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to definitions
 32 relative to the "Georgia Higher Education Facilities Authority Act," is amended by revising
 33 paragraph (3) as follows:

34 "(3) ~~'Board of technical and adult education' means the State Board of Technical and~~
 35 ~~Adult Education~~ Reserved."

36 **SECTION 3.**
