House Bill 49

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- To amend Article 2 of Chapter 4 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, 1
- 2 relating to technical and adult education, so as to change the name of the State Board of
- 3 Technical and Adult Education to the State Board of the Technical College System of
- Georgia; to amend various provisions of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated to change 4
- 5 references to reflect such name change; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting
- laws; and for other purposes. 6

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

8 **SECTION 1.**

- 9 Article 2 of Chapter 4 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 10 technical and adult education, is amended by revising Code Section 20-4-10, relating to the
- 11 establishment of the State Board of Technical and Adult Education, as follows:
- 12 "20-4-10.

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- 13 (a) There is established a the State Board of the Technical College System of Georgia,
- 14 formerly known as the State Board of Technical and Adult Education, consisting of not
- 15 fewer than one member from each congressional district and nine at-large members who
- shall be appointed by the Governor and confirmed by the Senate for five-year terms. Board 16
- 17 members in office on June 30, 2000, shall serve out the remainder of their respective terms.
- Upon expiration of those terms, the Governor shall appoint seven successors to two-year 19 terms, six successors to three-year terms, and six successors to five-year terms. All
- subsequent appointments shall be for regular five-year terms. Members shall represent 20
- 21 business, industry, or economic development. The board shall elect from its members a
- 22 chairperson, vice chairperson, and such other officers as are considered necessary, each to
- 23 serve for two-year terms. Officers may be elected to succeed themselves. Members shall
- 24 serve until their successors are appointed; however, in the event of a vacancy on the board
- 25 because of death, resignation, or removal for any reason other than expiration of a

26 member's term, the Governor shall fill such vacancy in the same manner as the original

- appointment and the person so appointed shall serve for the unexpired term of office.
- 28 (b) As used in this article, the term 'state board' means the State Board of Technical and
- 29 Adult Education the Technical College System of Georgia."
