A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Article 1 of Chapter 10 of Title 17 and Article 2 of Chapter 5 of Title 40 of the
- 2 Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to the procedure for sentencing and imposition
- 3 of punishment and the issuance, expiration, and renewal of drivers' licenses, respectively, so
- 4 as to provide that any person convicted of a felony offense shall have such conviction
- 5 demarcated on his or her driver's license for the length of his or her sentence; to provide for
- procedure; to amend Article 3 of Chapter 5 of Title 40 of the Official Code of Georgia 6
- 7 Annotated, relating to cancellation, suspension, and revocation of licenses, so as to provide
- 8 for license suspension under certain circumstances; to provide for related matters; to provide
- 9 for an effective date; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

11 **SECTION 1.**

- 12 Article 1 of Chapter 10 of Title 17 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to the
- 13 procedure for sentencing and imposition of punishment, is amended in Code Section 17-10-1,
- relating to the fixing of sentence, by adding a new subsection to read as follows: 14
- "(h) In sentencing any defendant convicted of a felony, other than a defendant who is 15
- 16 discharged without adjudication of guilt and who is not considered to have a criminal
- 17 conviction pursuant to Article 3 of Chapter 8 of Title 42, the judge shall inform the
- defendant that his or her driver's license shall be submitted to the Department of Driver 18
- 19 Services within 20 days of the date that the court imposed such sentence in order to have
- 20 a new driver's license issued with a demarcation for being a convicted felon and that failure
- to submit his or her license shall result in a license suspension. In the event that the
- 22 defendant's driver's license is lost or for any other reason surrender is impossible, a sworn

affidavit indicating the status of such license shall be submitted to the department. The

- court imposing such sentence shall forward, within three business days after such 24
- 25 conviction, a copy of its order of the disposition of the case to the Department of Driver
- Services." 26

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27 SECTION 2.

- 28 Article 2 of Chapter 5 of Title 40 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 29 issuance, expiration, and renewal of drivers' licenses, is amended by adding a new Code
- 30 section to read as follows:
- 31 "40-5-39.
- 32 (a) Any person who has been convicted of a felony shall be issued a replacement driver's
- 33 <u>license for a fee of \$25.00 bearing a demarcation of 'convicted felon,' and such license shall</u>
- 34 <u>be issued for the remaining period for which the original license was issued, and no</u>
- 35 <u>examination or eyesight test shall be required to obtain such replacement license. Renewal</u>
- 36 <u>licenses for such person shall bear such demarcation.</u>
- 37 (b) The 'convicted felon' demarcation shall remain on the defendant's driver's license for
- 38 the length of the defendant's sentence. If the defendant's sentence expires before the
- 39 expiration of the license, the defendant may apply for a replacement license for a fee of
- 40 \$25.00 which shall not bear such demarcation for the remaining period for which the
- 41 <u>original license was issued, and no examination or eyesight test shall be required to obtain</u>
- 42 <u>such replacement license.</u>
- 43 (c) The defendant shall submit his or her driver's license to the department as provided by
- 44 <u>subsection (h) of Code Section 17-10-1 and pursuant to the department's rules and</u>
- 45 <u>regulations governing such licenses."</u>

46 SECTION 3.

- 47 Article 3 of Chapter 5 of Title 40 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 48 cancellation, suspension, and revocation of licenses, is amended by adding a new Code
- 49 section to read as follows:
- 50 "<u>40-5-57.4.</u>
- Any person who is convicted of a felony who fails to surrender his or her driver's license
- 52 <u>or submit a lost license affidavit in accordance with subsection (h) of Code Section 17-10-1</u>
- and Code Section 40-5-38 shall have his or her license suspended for the balance of his or
- 54 <u>her sentence</u>. After the suspension period and after such person pays a restoration fee of
- \$60.00 or, if processed by mail, \$50.00, the suspension shall terminate, and the department
- shall return such driver's license to such person."

SECTION 4.

- This Act shall become effective upon its approval by the Governor or upon its becoming law
- 59 without such approval.

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SECTION 5.

All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
