A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
AN ACT

1 To amend Title 48 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to revenue and
2 taxation, so as to revise and add definitions relating to coin operated amusement machines;
3 to provide for fees; to authorize the commissioner of revenue to retain a portion of certain
4 fees as administrative costs; to provide that the commissioner is not authorized to impose any
5 additional fee; to provide for noncash redemption by gift card; to prohibit local governments
6 from prohibiting bona fide coin operated amusement machines or establishing the number
7 of such machines in certain circumstances; to authorize local governments to adopt any
8 combination of a list of ordinance provisions relating to bona fide coin operated amusement
9 machines; to provide for public inspection of certain information; to provide that certain
10 information shall be deemed trade secrets; to provide for certain promotions and contests and
11 the use of certain devices in promotions; to provide conditions, licensing, license fees, and
12 restrictions for such promotions and contests; to authorize the commissioner of revenue to
13 retain a portion of such fees as administrative costs; to authorize rules and regulations; to
14 provide for the authority of the commissioner regarding such promotions and contests and
15 for penalties; to provide for related matters; to provide for an effective date and applicability;
16 to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

17 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

18 **SECTION 1.**

19 Title 48 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to revenue and taxation, is
20 amended by revising paragraphs (2.2) and (2.3) of Code Section 48-17-1, relating to
21 definitions relative to coin operated amusement machines, and adding new paragraphs to
22 read as follows:

23 "(2.2) 'Class A machine' means a bona fide coin operated amusement machine that is not
24 a Class B machine, does not allow a successful player to carry over points won on one
25 play to a subsequent play or plays, and:

26 (A) Provides no reward to a successful player; or

- 27 (B) Rewards a successful player only with free replays or additional time to play;
- 28 (C) Rewards a successful player with noncash merchandise, prizes, toys, gift
- 29 certificates, or novelties in compliance with the provisions of subsection (c) or
- 30 paragraph (1) of subsection (d) of Code Section 16-12-35, and does not reward a
- 31 successful player with any item prohibited as a reward in subsection (i) of Code
- 32 Section 16-12-35 or any reward redeemable as an item prohibited as a reward in
- 33 subsection (i) of Code Section 16-12-35;
- 34 (D) Rewards a successful player with points, tokens, tickets, or other evidence of
- 35 winnings that may be exchanged only for items listed in subparagraph (C) of this
- 36 paragraph; or
- 37 (E) Rewards a successful player with any combination of items listed in
- 38 subparagraphs (B), (C) , or (D) of this paragraph.

39 (2.3) 'Class B machine' means a bona fide coin operated amusement machine that

40 ~~rewards a successful player with any combination of items listed in subparagraphs~~

41 ~~(d)(1)(B) and (d)(1)(C) of Code Section 16-12-35~~ allows a successful player to accrue

42 points on the machine and carry over points won on one play to a subsequent play or

43 plays in accordance with paragraph (2) of subsection (d) of Code Section 16-12-35 and:

- 44 (A) Rewards a successful player in compliance with the provisions of paragraphs (1)
- 45 and (2) of subsection (d) of Code Section 16-12-35; and
- 46 (B) Does not reward a successful player with any item prohibited as a reward in
- 47 subsection (i) of Code Section 16-12-35 or any reward redeemable as an item
- 48 prohibited as a reward in subsection (i) of Code Section 16-12-35."

49 "(3.05) 'Gift card' means a plastic card given as a reward to a successful player of a bona

50 fide coin operated amusement machine:

- 51 (A) That has a magnetic strip allowing only noncash redemption;
- 52 (B) Is configured to subtract automatically the applicable sales or use tax in addition
- 53 to the dollar value of the noncash redemption; and
- 54 (C) May not lawfully be redeemed for cash, a firearm, alcohol, tobacco, a lottery ticket,
- 55 or any item enabling participation in a lottery.

56 (3.06) 'Gift certificate' is a document, electronic transmission, coupon, or other medium

57 of exchange, other than currency or a gift card. A gift certificate can be exchanged for

58 noncash merchandise, prizes, toys, or novelties for which applicable sales or use tax may

59 or may not be subtracted."

60 **SECTION 2.**

61 Said title is further amended by revising subsection (a) of Code Section 48-17-2, relating to

62 license fees regarding coin operated amusement machines, as follows:

63 "(a) Every owner, except an owner holding a bona fide coin operated amusement machine
 64 solely for personal use or resale, who offers others the opportunity to play for a charge,
 65 whether directly or indirectly, any bona fide coin operated amusement machine shall pay
 66 annual master license fees as follows:

67 (1) For Class A machines:

68 (A) For five or fewer machines, the owner shall pay a master license fee of \$500.00.
 69 In the event such owner acquires a sixth or greater number of machines during a
 70 calendar year which require a certificate for lawful operation under this chapter so that
 71 the total number of machines owned does not exceed 60 machines or more, such owner
 72 shall pay an additional master license fee of \$1,500.00;

73 (B) For six or more machines but not more than 60 machines, the owner shall pay a
 74 master license fee of \$2,000.00. In the event such owner acquires a sixty-first or
 75 greater number of machines during a calendar year which require a certificate for lawful
 76 operation under this chapter, such owner shall pay an additional master license fee of
 77 \$1,500.00; or

78 (C) For 61 or more machines, the owner shall pay a master license fee of \$3,500.00;
 79 and

80 (2) For any number of Class B machines, the owner shall pay a master license fee of
 81 \$5,000.00.

82 The cost of the license shall be paid to the commissioner by company check, cash, cashier's
 83 check, or money order, and the commissioner shall be authorized to retain as the cost of
 84 administration an amount not to exceed \$75.00. Upon said payment, the commissioner
 85 shall issue a master license certificate to the owner. The master license fee levied by this
 86 Code section shall be collected by the commissioner on an annual basis for the period from
 87 July 1 to June 30. The commissioner may establish procedures for master license
 88 collection and set due dates for these license payments. No refund or credit of the master
 89 license charge levied by this Code section may be allowed to any owner who ceases the
 90 operation of bona fide coin operated amusement machines prior to the end of any license
 91 or permit period."

92 **SECTION 3.**

93 Said title is further amended by revising subsection (a.1) of Code Section 48-17-2, relating
 94 to license fees regarding coin operated amusement machines, and adding a new subsection
 95 to read as follows:

96 "(a.1) Every business owner or business operator shall pay an annual location license fee
 97 for each bona fide coin operated amusement machine offered to the public for play. The
 98 annual location license fee shall be \$25.00 for each Class A machine and \$125.00 for each

99 Class B machine. The annual location license fee levied by this Code section shall be
 100 collected by the commissioner on an annual basis from July 1 to June 30. The location
 101 license fee shall be paid to the commissioner by company check, cash, cashier's check, or
 102 money order, and the commissioner shall be authorized to retain from such fees as the cost
 103 of administration an amount not to exceed 12 percent of such fees. Upon payment, the
 104 commissioner shall issue a location license certificate that shall state the number of bona
 105 fide coin operated amusement machines permitted for each class without further
 106 description or identification of specific machines. The commissioner may establish
 107 procedures for location license fee collection and set due dates for payment of such fees.
 108 No refund or credit of the location license fee shall be allowed to any business owner or
 109 business operator who ceases to offer bona fide coin operated amusement machines to the
 110 public for commercial use prior the end of any license period.
 111 (a.2) The commissioner shall not be authorized to impose any fee in addition to those fees
 112 set forth in this chapter."

113 **SECTION 4.**

114 Said title is further amended by revising subsection (j) of Code Section 48-17-2, relating to
 115 license fees regarding coin operated amusement machines, as follows:

116 "(j) ~~An application is~~ The name and address of each entity applying for a master license
 117 as well as the name and address and license number of each entity issued a master license
 118 shall be subject to public inspection. However, all other information, including the
 119 locations where machines are installed or located as well as information contained in
 120 location license applications and licenses, shall not be subject to public inspection and shall
 121 not be subject to disclosure under Article 4 of Chapter 18 of Title 50."

122 **SECTION 5.**

123 Said title is further amended by revising subsection (a) of Code Section 48-17-9, relating to
 124 payment and collection of annual permit fee, as follows:

125 "(a) Every owner, except an owner holding a coin operated amusement machine solely for
 126 personal use or resale, who offers others the opportunity to play for a charge, whether
 127 direct or indirect, any bona fide coin operated amusement machine shall pay an annual
 128 permit fee for each bona fide coin operated amusement machine in the amount of \$25.00
 129 for each Class A machine and \$125.00 for each Class B machine. The fee shall be paid to
 130 the commissioner by company check, cash, cashier's check, or money order, and the
 131 commissioner shall be authorized to retain from such fees as the cost of administration an
 132 amount not to exceed 12 percent of such fees. Upon payment, the commissioner shall issue
 133 a sticker for each bona fide coin operated amusement machine. The annual fees levied by

134 this chapter shall be collected by the commissioner on an annual basis for the period from
 135 July 1 to June 30. The commissioner may establish procedures for annual collection and
 136 set due dates for the fee payments. No refund or credit of the annual fee levied by this
 137 chapter shall be allowed to any owner who ceases the exhibition or display of any bona fide
 138 coin operated amusement machine prior to the end of any license or permit period."

139 SECTION 6.

140 Said title is further amended by adding new Code sections to read as follows:

141 "48-17-17.

142 (a) It shall be lawful to give rewards to a successful player of a bona fide coin operated
 143 amusement machine in the form of a gift card, provided that the gift card does not exceed
 144 \$5.00 in value per play of the bona fide coin operated amusement machine.

145 (b) Giving a successful player cash for a gift card or change in cash for the remaining
 146 value of a gift card shall be a misdemeanor of a high and aggravated nature. Receipt of
 147 cash for all or part of the value of a gift card by a successful player shall be a misdemeanor
 148 of a high and aggravated nature.

149 (c) Redemption of a gift card by a successful player for a firearm, alcohol, tobacco, a
 150 lottery ticket, or any item enabling participation in a lottery shall be a misdemeanor of a
 151 high and aggravated nature by the person who receives the prohibited item or items.

152 48-17-18.

153 (a) Provided that the business owner or business operator and the owner or operator of a
 154 bona fide coin operated amusement machine have complied with the provisions of Code
 155 Section 16-12-35 and of this chapter, the governing authority of the county or municipal
 156 corporation where such bona fide coin operated amusement machine is located shall not
 157 be authorized to:

158 (1) Prohibit the possession, use, or offering to the public of a bona fide coin operated
 159 amusement machine in any lawful business; or

160 (2) Establish the number of bona fide coin operated amusement machines in any lawful
 161 business except as otherwise provided in paragraph (1) of subsection (b) of this Code
 162 section.

163 (b) The governing authority of any county or municipal corporation shall be authorized to
 164 enact and enforce an ordinance which includes any combination of the following
 165 provisions:

166 (1) Permitting the offering to the public of more than nine bona fide coin operated
 167 amusement machines that reward the player exclusively with noncash merchandise,
 168 prizes, toys, gift certificates, or novelties at the same business location;

169 (2) Requiring the owner or operator of a business location which offers to the public any
 170 bona fide coin operated amusement machine that rewards the player exclusively as
 171 described in subsection (d) of Code Section 16-12-35 to inform all employees of the
 172 prohibitions and penalties set out in subsections (e), (f), and (g) of Code
 173 Section 16-12-35;

174 (3) Requiring the owner or possessor of any bona fide coin operated amusement machine
 175 that rewards the player exclusively as described in subsection (d) of Code
 176 Section 16-12-35 to inform each business owner or business operator of the business
 177 location where such machine is located of the prohibitions and penalties set out in
 178 subsections (e), (f), and (g) of Code Section 16-12-35;

179 (4) Providing for the suspension or revocation of a license granted by such local
 180 governing authority to manufacture, distribute, or sell alcoholic beverages or for the
 181 suspension or revocation of any other license granted by such local governing authority
 182 as a penalty for conviction of the business owner or business operator of a violation of
 183 subsection (e), (f), or (g) of Code Section 16-12-35, or both. An ordinance providing for
 184 the suspension or revocation of a license shall conform to the due process guidelines for
 185 granting, refusal, suspension, or revocation of a license for the manufacture, distribution,
 186 or sale of alcoholic beverages set out in subsection (b) of Code Section 3-3-2;

187 (5) Providing for penalties, including fines or suspension or revocation of a license as
 188 provided in paragraph (4) of this subsection, or both, for a violation of any ordinance
 189 enacted pursuant to this subsection; provided, however, that a municipal corporation shall
 190 not be authorized to impose any penalty greater than the maximum penalty authorized by
 191 such municipal corporation's charter;

192 (6) Requiring any business owner or business operator subject to paragraph (1) of
 193 subsection (b) of Code Section 48-17-15 to provide to the local governing authority a
 194 copy of each verified monthly report prepared in accordance with such Code section,
 195 incorporating the provisions of such Code section in the ordinance, and providing for any
 196 and all of the penalties authorized by subsection (d) of Code Section 48-17-15;

197 (7) Requiring the business owner or business operator of any business location which
 198 offers to the public one or more bona fide coin operated amusement machines to post
 199 prominently a notice including the following or substantially similar language:

200 'GEORGIA LAW PROHIBITS PAYMENT OR RECEIPT OF MONEY FOR
 201 WINNING A GAME OR GAMES ON THIS AMUSEMENT MACHINE; PAYMENT
 202 OR RECEIPT OF MONEY FOR FREE REPLAYS WON ON THIS AMUSEMENT
 203 MACHINE; PAYMENT OR RECEIPT OF MONEY FOR ANY MERCHANDISE,
 204 PRIZE, TOY, GIFT CERTIFICATE, OR NOVELTY WON ON THIS AMUSEMENT
 205 MACHINE; OR AWARDING ANY MERCHANDISE, PRIZE, TOY, GIFT

206 CERTIFICATE, OR NOVELTY OF A VALUE EXCEEDING \$5.00 FOR A SINGLE
 207 PLAY OF THIS MACHINE.;
 208 (8) Providing for restrictions relating to distance from specified structures or uses so long
 209 as those distance requirements are no more restrictive than such requirements applicable
 210 to the sale of alcoholic beverages;
 211 (9) Requiring as a condition for doing business in the jurisdiction disclosure by the
 212 business owner or business operator of the name and address of the owner of the bona
 213 fide coin operated amusement machine or machines;
 214 (10) Requiring that all bona fide coin operated amusement machines are placed and kept
 215 in plain view and accessible to any person who is at the business location; and
 216 (11) Requiring a business that offers one or more bona fide coin operated amusement
 217 machines to the public for play to post its business license or occupation tax certificate."

218 **SECTION 7.**

219 Said title is further amended by adding a new chapter to read as follows:

220 "CHAPTER 18

221 48-18-1.

222 A promotion, contest, or sweepstakes whereby a business or a nonprofit organization
 223 qualified under Section 501(c) of the federal Internal Revenue Code, as amended, gives
 224 away noncash prizes that cannot be exchanged or redeemed for cash to persons selected by
 225 lot shall not be a lottery as defined in Code Section 16-12-20 and shall not be an unfair or
 226 deceptive practice under Article 15 of Title 10, the 'Fair Business Practices Act of 1975,'
 227 if such prizes are awarded in compliance with the following conditions:

228 (1) Such promotions, contests, or sweepstakes are conducted as advertising and
 229 promotional undertakings in good faith for the purpose of advertising the goods, wares,
 230 and merchandise of such business or to advance the purposes of such nonprofit
 231 organization; provided, however, that a business may participate in a promotion, contest,
 232 or sweepstakes to advance the purposes of a nonprofit organization;

233 (2) To be eligible to receive a prize or prizes a person may, but shall not be required to:

234 (A) Pay any tangible consideration to the operator of such business or to such nonprofit
 235 organization in the form of money or other property or thing of value;

236 (B) Purchase any goods, wares, merchandise, or anything of value from such business
 237 or such nonprofit organization; or

238 (C) Be present or be asked to participate in a seminar, sales presentation, or any other
 239 presentation, by whatever name denominated;

240 (3) The rules or procedures for eligibility for a prize or prizes shall be posted or made
 241 available to those persons considering participation in a promotion, contest, or
 242 sweepstakes. Such rules or procedures shall clearly and conspicuously allow a person to
 243 become eligible without paying any tangible consideration to the operator of such
 244 business or to such nonprofit organization in the form of money or other property or thing
 245 of value; without purchasing any goods, wares, merchandise, or anything of value from
 246 such business or nonprofit organization; and without being present or participating in a
 247 seminar, sales presentation, or any other presentation, by whatever name denominated;
 248 (4) The method actually used to select winners of a prize or prizes shall not discriminate
 249 against persons who have entered without paying any tangible consideration, without
 250 purchasing any item, and without being present for or participating in a seminar, sales
 251 presentation, or other presentation, by whatever name denominated; and
 252 (5) Prizes shall not include or be redeemable for any item prohibited as a reward to a
 253 successful player of bona fide coin operated amusement machines in subsection (i) of
 254 Code Section 16-12-35.

255 48-18-2.

256 A promotion, contest, or sweepstakes whereby a business or a nonprofit organization
 257 qualified under Section 501(c) of the federal Internal Revenue Code, as amended, gives
 258 away noncash prizes that cannot be exchanged or redeemed for cash to a successful player
 259 of a mechanical or electronic device or devices shall not be an unfair or deceptive practice
 260 under Article 15 of Title 10, the 'Fair Business Practices Act of 1975,' and the mechanical
 261 or electronic device or devices used in such promotion, contest, or sweepstakes shall not
 262 be gambling devices, as defined in Code Section 16-12-20, if such prizes are awarded in
 263 compliance with the following conditions:

264 (1) Such promotions, contests, or sweepstakes are conducted as advertising and
 265 promotional undertakings in good faith for the purpose of advertising the goods, wares,
 266 and merchandise of such business or to advance the purposes of such nonprofit
 267 organization; provided, however, that a business may participate in a promotion, contest,
 268 or sweepstakes to advance the purposes of a nonprofit organization;

269 (2) To be eligible to play the mechanical or electronic device or devices and win a prize
 270 or prizes a person may, but shall not be required to:

271 (A) Pay any tangible consideration to the operator of such business or to such nonprofit
 272 organization in the form of money or other property or thing of value;

273 (B) Purchase any goods, wares, merchandise, or anything of value from such business
 274 or such nonprofit organization; or

275 (C) Be present or be asked to participate in a seminar, sales presentation, or any other
 276 presentation, by whatever name denominated;

277 (3) The rules or procedures for the promotion, contest, or sweepstakes shall be posted
 278 or made available to those persons considering participation in a promotion, contest, or
 279 sweepstakes. Such rules or procedures shall clearly and conspicuously allow a person to
 280 become eligible to play the mechanical or electronic device or devices and win a prize
 281 or prizes without paying any tangible consideration to the operator of such business or
 282 to such nonprofit organization in the form of money or other property or thing of value;
 283 without purchasing any goods, wares, merchandise, or anything of value from such
 284 business or nonprofit organization; and without being present or participating in a
 285 seminar, sales presentation, or any other presentation, by whatever name denominated;

286 (4) A successful player of a mechanical or electronic device shall be eligible for a
 287 noncash prize whether or not such successful player paid any tangible consideration to
 288 the operator of such business or to such nonprofit organization in the form of money or
 289 other property or thing of value; purchased any goods, wares, merchandise, or anything
 290 of value from such business or nonprofit organization; and was present or participated in
 291 a seminar, sales presentation, or any other presentation, by whatever name denominated;

292 (5) In offering promotional, contest, or sweepstakes prizes to the public by means of a
 293 mechanical or electronic device or devices, a business or nonprofit organization shall:

294 (A) Not offer more than two such promotions, contests, or sweepstakes using such
 295 devices in a location at the same time;

296 (B) Not offer more than two mechanical or electronic devices in a location at the same
 297 time;

298 (C) Use only mechanical or electronic devices that require the exercise of 'some skill'
 299 as such term is defined in Code Section 16-12-35;

300 (D) Use only mechanical or electronic devices that serve only one participant at a time;

301 (E) Allow a total of no more than two natural persons to participate in promotions,
 302 contests, or sweepstakes in a location at the same time; and

303 (F) Comply with the noncash redemption provisions of subsection (c) or (d) of Code
 304 Section 16-12-35 with respect to the limitation on the value of prizes to \$5.00 per play;
 305 and

306 (6) Prizes shall not include or be redeemable for any item prohibited as a reward to a
 307 successful player of bona fide coin operated amusement machines by subsection (i) of
 308 Code Section 16-12-35.

309 48-18-3.

310 (a) As used in this Code section, the term:

311 (1) 'Business location' means any structure, vehicle, or establishment where a business
312 is conducted.

313 (2) 'Gross retail receipts' means the total revenue derived by a business at any one
314 business location from the sale of goods and services and the commission earned at any
315 one business location on the sale of goods and services but shall not include revenue from
316 the sale of goods and services for which the business will receive only a commission.
317 Revenue from the sale of goods and services at wholesale shall not be included.

318 (b) No business conducting a promotion, contest, or sweepstakes using a mechanical or
319 electronic device or devices, as described in Code Section 48-18-2, shall derive more than
320 50 percent of its monthly gross retail receipts for the business location from the total of the
321 following:

322 (1) Receipts from mechanical or electronic devices used in a promotion or promotions,
323 contest or contests, or sweepstakes; and

324 (2) Receipts from Class B bona fide coin operated amusement devices.

325 (c) For each business location which offers to the public one or more promotions, contests,
326 or sweepstakes using one or more mechanical or electronic devices, the owner or operator
327 of such business shall prepare a monthly verified report setting out separately the gross
328 retail receipts from the promotion or promotions, contest or contests, or sweepstakes and
329 the gross retail receipts for the business location.

330 (d) The owner or operator of a business offering one or more promotions, contests, or
331 sweepstakes by using one or more mechanical or electronic devices shall report the
332 information required by subsection (c) of this Code section to the commissioner of revenue
333 in the form and electronic format required by the commissioner. The commissioner is
334 authorized to audit any records for a business subject to this Code section.

335 48-18-4.

336 (a) The commissioner of revenue shall license promotions, contests, and sweepstakes for
337 giving away noncash prizes by lot described in Code Section 48-18-1 and promotions,
338 contests, and sweepstakes for giving away noncash prizes to successful players of
339 mechanical or electronic devices described in Code Section 48-18-2. Each license shall be
340 for a period of 12 months, beginning July 1 and ending June 30 of the following calendar
341 year. It shall be a violation of this Code section to conduct an unlicensed promotion,
342 contest, or sweepstakes, and a person who conducts an unlicensed promotion, contest, or
343 sweepstakes shall be required to pay the fee for a license in addition to the penalties set out
344 in subsection (c) of this Code Section.

345 (b) The commissioner is authorized to promulgate rules and regulations necessary to
346 administer such licenses.

- 347 (c) The commissioner shall have the authority to:
- 348 (1) Inspect a mechanical or electronic device used in a promotion, contest, or
 349 sweepstakes and the records pertaining to a promotion, contest, or sweepstakes;
- 350 (2) Impose a civil fine not exceed \$10,000.00 and revoke or refuse to renew a license as
 351 penalties for using in a promotion or promotions, contest or contests, or sweepstakes a
 352 mechanical or electronic device or devices that do not require some skill; and
- 353 (3)(A) Impose a civil fine not to exceed \$1,000.00 for each violation of this chapter or
 354 the regulations issued pursuant to this chapter by the commissioner other than using a
 355 no-skill device or devices;
- 356 (B) Revoke or refuse to renew a license if the licensee has violated the provisions of
 357 this chapter or the regulations issued pursuant to this chapter by the commissioner other
 358 than using a no-skill device or devices; or
- 359 (C) Impose a civil fine and revoke or refuse to renew a license for such violations.
- 360 (d) The commissioner is authorized to provide by rule or regulation for annual license fees
 361 not to exceed:
- 362 (1) One hundred dollars for a promotion, contest, or sweepstakes described in Code
 363 Section 48-18-1;
- 364 (2) Five thousand dollars for an annual master license and a \$125.00 sticker license fee
 365 for each mechanical or electronic device to be paid by the owner of the device for
 366 promotions, contests, or sweepstakes described in Section 48-18-2; and
- 367 (3) One hundred twenty-five dollars for an annual location license fee for each
 368 mechanical or electronic device at a location to be paid by the owner or operator of the
 369 location.
- 370 The commissioner is authorized to retain an amount not to exceed \$75.00 of the annual
 371 master license fee as administrative costs. The commissioner is authorized to retain as
 372 administrative costs an amount not to exceed 12 percent of other fees authorized in this
 373 Code section. The commissioner is not authorized to impose any fee in addition to those
 374 authorized in this Code section.
- 375 (e) The name and address of each entity applying for a master license as well as the name
 376 and address and license number of each entity issued a master license shall be subject to
 377 public inspection. However, the locations where mechanical or electronic devices are
 378 installed or located shall not be subject to inspection and shall not be subject to disclosure
 379 under Article 4 of Chapter 18 of Title 50."

380

SECTION 8.

381 This Act shall become effective on July 1, 2011, and apply to conduct that occurs on and
 382 after such date. It is not the intention of this Act to abate any prosecution undertaken for

383 conduct occurring under the law in effect prior to such date, and any offense committed
384 before July 1, 2011, shall be prosecuted and punished under the statutes in effect at the time
385 the offense was committed.

SECTION 9.

387 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
