A RESOLUTION

- 1 Honoring the life and memory of Mr. Glynn Greenway; and for other purposes.
- 2 WHEREAS, the State of Georgia mourns the loss of one of its most distinguished citizens
3 with the passing of Mr. Glynn Greenway on January 17, 2011; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Mr. Greenway was born in Kite, Georgia, a beloved son of the late William and
5 Annie Fortner; and
- 6 WHEREAS, he graduated from Warner Robins High School and served as a guardian of this
7 nation's freedom and liberty with the United States Air Force; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Mr. Greenway opened Greenway Insurance Agency in 1960 and was very
9 involved in real estate development in Warner Robins; and
- 10 WHEREAS, he was active in the Warner Robins Industry Now Group, the Board of
11 Directors for Citizens and Southern Bank, the Warner Robins Development Authority, the
12 Warner Robins Housing Authority, the Board of Directors of Atlantic Southern Bank of
13 Warner Robins, and the Board of Directors of the Middle Georgia Technical College; and
- 14 WHEREAS, his leadership and guidance were instrumental as vice president of the Warner
15 Robins Chamber of Commerce, chairman of the Warner Robins Building Authority, and
16 chairman of the Houston County Development Authority; and
- 17 WHEREAS, this community leader devoted nearly 20 years to the Houston County Hospital
18 Authority, serving as chairman and vice chairman for many years; and
- 19 WHEREAS, Mr. Greenway was united in love and marriage to the late Jeane Scalzo in 1959
20 and, after her passing, he married the late Pamela Richard in 1994 and enjoyed traveling and
21 spending time with her over the years; and

22 WHEREAS, he was blessed with support of his remarkable children, Diane Greenway,
23 Christy and Greg Wright, and Tracy and Wiley Richards, and four wonderful grandchildren,
24 William, Anna, Bennett, and Bradley; and

25 WHEREAS, he gave inspiration to many through his high ideals, morals, and deep concern
26 for his fellow citizens, and the devotion, patience, and understanding he demonstrated to his
27 family and friends were admired by others; and

28 WHEREAS, he was a person of magnanimous strengths with an unimpeachable reputation
29 for integrity, intelligence, fairness, and kindness and, by the example he made of his life, he
30 made this world a better place in which to live; and

31 WHEREAS, a compassionate and generous man, Mr. Greenway will long be remembered
32 for his love of family and friendship, and this loyal father, grandfather, and friend will be
33 missed by all who had the great fortune of knowing him.

35 join in honoring the life and memory of Mr. Glynn Greenway and express their deepest and
