A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

1 To provide a new charter for the City of Grayson, Georgia amending an Act creating the City 2 of Grayson, Georgia approved December 16, 1901 (Ga. L. 1901, P. 662), as amended; to 3 provide for incorporation, boundaries, and powers of the city, both specific and general; to 4 provide for construction of powers, exercise of powers and ordinances of the city; to provide 5 the ability to sue and be sued; to provide for the governing authority of such city, the terms of office, qualification for office, the creation of vacancies, and the filling of vacancies in 6 7 office; to provide for compensation of members of the governing authority; to provide 8 prohibitions for elected officials; to authorize inquiries and investigations by the governing 9 authority; to provide general powers and authority of the governing authority; to provide for 10 organization, meetings, rules and procedures, voting and enactment of ordinances; to provide 11 for a code of technical regulations; to provide for the office of mayor and certain duties and 12 powers relative to the office of mayor; to provide the authenticating of ordinances and the 13 recording codification and printing of ordinances; to provide for administrative and service 14 departments, boards, commissions and authorities, a city manager, a city attorney, a city 15 clerk, a tax collector, a city accountant, consolidation of functions, position classifications 16 and pay plans, and personnel policies; to provide for the creation of a municipal court, 17 appointment of judges of the municipal court, the time of convening of the court and the jurisdiction and powers of the municipal court and a process for the appeal of decisions of 18 19 the municipal court and the adoption of rules of the municipal court; to provide for regular 20 elections, qualifying and nomination of candidates, absentee ballots, nonpartisan elections, 21 election of governing authorities by a majority vote, application of general laws, special 22 elections and filling of vacancies, grounds for removal of members of the governing 23 authority and a procedure for removal; to provide for property taxes, tax levies, tax due dates 24 and the issuance of tax bills, collection of delinquent taxes, licenses, occupational taxes, 25 excise taxes, sewer service charges, sanitary and health service charges, stormwater fees and 26 charges, franchises and franchise fees, special assessments, transfer of executions, general obligation bonds, revenue bonds, short term notes, procedures for establishment of a fiscal 27 28 year, preparation of budgets, submission of operating budgets to the city council, action by

council on budgets, property tax levies, additional appropriations, capital improvements budget, contracting procedures, centralized purchasing and disposition of city property; to provide for bonded and other indebtedness; to provide for official bonds for officers and employees of the city; to provide for continuation of existing ordinances and regulations; to provide for definitions and constructions and penalties; to provide for severability; to provide for an effective date; to provide for other matters relative to the foregoing; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

36 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

37 ARTICLE I. 38 INCORPORATION AND POWERS 39 SECTION 1.10. 40 Incorporation.

This city and the inhabitants thereof are constituted and declared a body politic and corporate 41 under the name and style City of Grayson, Georgia, and by that name shall have perpetual 42 43 succession. Under that name, the city shall continue to be vested with all the property and 44 rights of property which now belong to the corporation; may sue and be sued; may contract 45 and be contracted with; may acquire and hold property, real and personal as may be devised, 46 bequeathed, sold or in any manner conveyed or dedicated to or otherwise acquired by it, and 47 from time to time may hold or invest, sell, or dispose of the same; may have a common seal 48 and alter and renew the same at will; and may exercise in conformity with this charter all municipal powers, functions, rights, privileges, and immunities of every name and nature 49 50 whatsoever.

SECTION 1.11.

52 Corporate boundaries.

(a) The city shall encompass all of the territory described within the following boundaries: 53 (1) The boundaries of this city shall be those existing on the effective date of the adoption 54 of this charter and as further described in Exhibit "A," which is attached to this charter and 55 is incorporated herein by reference. Upon the adoption of this charter, the boundaries of 56 this city shall include all of that area as described in the previous city charter as well as any 57 58 areas added by amendment to said charter, and by all annexation ordinances adopted by the 59 governing authority of the City of Grayson since the adoption of the charter. The 60 boundaries of this city shall include those areas shown on a map entitled "Official

61 Boundary Map of the City of Grayson, Georgia" dated December 20, 2010, which map 62 shall be retained permanently in the office of the city clerk and which map is incorporated 63 herein by this reference. Alterations of the boundaries of this city may be made from time 64 to time in a manner provided by law. The boundaries of this city at all times shall be shown on a map to be retained permanently in the office of the city clerk and to be 65 designated: "Official Map of the Corporate Limits of the City of Grayson, Georgia." 66 Photographic, typed, or other copies of such map certified by the city clerk shall be 67 admitted as evidence in all courts and shall have the same force and effect as with the 68 69 original map.

70 (2) The city council may provide for the redrawing of any such map by ordinance to reflect

1 lawful changes in the corporate boundaries. A redrawn map shall supersede for all
purposes the entire map or maps which it is designated to replace.

SECTION 1.12.

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Powers and construction.

(a) This city shall have all powers possible for a city to have under the present or future
constitution and laws of the State of Georgia as fully and completely as though they were
specifically enumerated in this charter. This city shall have all the powers of
self-government not otherwise prohibited by this charter or by general law.

(b) The powers of this city shall be construed liberally in favor of the city. The specific
mention or failure to mention particular powers shall not be construed as limiting in any way
the powers of this city.

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SECTION 1.13.

B Examples of powers.

84 (a) The corporate powers of the government of the city, to be exercised by the governing85 authority, may include the following:

86 (1) Air and water pollution. To regulate the emission of smoke or other exhaust which
87 pollutes the air and to prevent the pollution of natural streams which flow within the
88 corporate limits of the city.

(2) Animal regulations. To regulate and license or to prohibit the keeping or running at
large of animals and fowl and to provide for the impoundment of same if in violation of
any ordinance or lawful order; to provide for the disposition by sale, gift, or humane
destruction of animals and fowl when not redeemed as provided by ordinance; and to
provide punishment for violation of ordinances enacted under this paragraph.

94 (3) Appropriations and expenditures. To make appropriations for the support of the
95 government of the city; to authorize the expenditure of money for any purposes authorized
96 by this charter and for any purpose for which a municipality is authorized by the laws of
97 the State of Georgia; and to provide for the payment of expenses of this city.

98 (4) Building regulations. To regulate and to license the erection and construction of
99 buildings and all other structures; to adopt building, housing, plumbing, electrical, gas, and
100 heating and air-conditioning codes; and to regulate all housing and building trades.

(5) Business regulation and taxation. To levy and to provide for the collection of license
fees and taxes on privileges, occupations, trades, and professions; to license and regulate
the same; to provide for the manner and method of payment of such licenses and taxes; and
to revoke such licenses after due process for the failure to pay any city taxes or fees.

(6) Condemnation. To condemn property, inside or outside the corporate limits of the city,
for present or future use and for any corporate purpose deemed necessary by the governing

authority, utilizing procedures enumerated in Title 22 of the O.C.G.A. or such other laws
as are, or may hereafter be, enacted.

(7) Contracts. To enter into contracts and agreements with other governmental entities andwith private persons, firms, and corporations.

111 (8) Emergencies. To establish procedures for determining and proclaiming that an 112 emergency situation exists inside or outside the city and to make and carry out all 113 reasonable provisions deemed necessary to deal with or meet such an emergency for the 114 protection, safety, health, or well-being of the citizens of the city.

(9) Environmental Protection. To protect and preserve the natural resources, environment and vital areas of the city, region, and state through the preservation and improvement of air quality, the restoration and maintenance of water resources, the control of erosion and

sedimentation, and other necessary actions for the protection of the environment.

(10) Fire regulations. To fix and establish fire limits and from time to time extend,
enlarge, or restrict the same; to prescribe fire safety regulations, not inconsistent with
general law relating to both fire prevention and detection and to firefighting; and to
prescribe penalties and punishment for violations thereof.

(11) Garbage fees. To levy, fix, assess, and collect a garbage, refuse, and trash collection and disposal and other sanitary service charge, tax, or fee for such services as may be necessary in the operation of the city from all individuals, firms, and corporations residing in or doing business within the city and benefitting from such services; to enforce the payment of such charges, taxes, or fees; and to provide for the manner and method of collecting such service charges; and to provide for franchises, including exclusive franchises, for trash collection and disposal. (12) General health, safety, and welfare. To define, regulate, and prohibit any act,
practice, conduct, or use of property which is detrimental to the health, sanitation,
cleanliness, welfare, and safety of the inhabitants of the city and to provide for the
enforcement of such standards.

(13) Gifts. To accept or refuse gifts, donations, bequests, or grants from any source for
any purpose related to the powers and duties of the city and the general welfare of its
citizens on such terms and conditions as the donor or grantor may impose.

(14) Health and sanitation. To prescribe standards of health and sanitation and to providefor the enforcement of such standards.

(15) Jail sentences. To provide that persons given jail sentences in the city's court may
work out such sentences in any public works or on the streets, roads, drains, and squares
of the city; to provide for the commitment of such persons to any jail; or to provide for the
commitment of such persons to any county work camp or county jail by agreement with
the appropriate county officials.

(16) Litigation. To bring or defend an action, at law or in equity, brought in a court ofproper jurisdiction and to assert any and all defenses permitted by law.

(17) Motor vehicles. To regulate the operation of motor vehicles and exercise control over
all traffic, including parking, upon or across the streets, roads, alleys, and walkways of the
city.

149 (18) Municipal agencies and delegation of power. To create, alter, or abolish departments,

150 boards, offices, commissions, and agencies of the city and to confer upon such agencies the

necessary and appropriate authority for carrying out all the powers conferred upon ordelegated to the same.

153 (19) Municipal debts. To appropriate and borrow money for the payment of debts of the

city and to issue bonds for the purpose of raising revenue to carry out any project, program,or venture authorized by this charter or the laws of the State of Georgia.

156 (20) Municipal property ownership. To acquire, dispose of, and hold in trust or otherwise

157 any real, personal, or mixed property, in fee simple or lesser interest, inside or outside the

property limits of the city and to lease property owned by the city for a period not to exceed

159 25 years or for such other length of time as permitted by law.

160 (21) Municipal property protection. To provide for the preservation and protection of

161 property and equipment of the city and the administration and use of same by the public;

and to prescribe penalties and punishment for violations thereof.

(22) Municipal utilities. To acquire, lease, construct, operate, maintain, sell, and disposeof public utilities, including, but not limited to, a system of waterworks, sewers and drains,

165 sewage disposal, gas works, electric light plants, transportation facilities, public airports,

- and any other public utility; and to fix the taxes, charges, rates, fares, fees, assessments,

regulations, and penalties therefor; and to provide for the withdrawal of service for refusalor failure to pay the same.

- 169 (23) Nuisances. To define a nuisance and provide for its abatement whether on public or170 private property.
- (24) Specific penalties. To provide penalties for violation of any ordinances adopted
 pursuant to the authority of this charter and the laws of the State of Georgia, and to provide
 penalties for the violation of Gwinnett County board of health rules and regulations and
 Gwinnett County health and sanitation ordinances.
- (25) Planning and zoning. To provide comprehensive city planning for development by
 zoning and to provide subdivision regulation and the like as the city council deems
 necessary and reasonable to ensure a safe, healthy, and aesthetically pleasing community.
 (26) Police and fire protection. To exercise the power of arrest through duly appointed
- police officers and to establish, operate, or contract for a police or firefighting agency.
- (27) Public hazards; removal. To provide for the destruction and removal of any buildingor other structure which is or may become dangerous or detrimental to the public.
- (28) Public improvements. To provide for the acquisition, construction, building, 182 operation, and maintenance of public ways, parks and playgrounds, recreational facilities, 183 184 cemeteries, markets and market houses, public buildings, libraries, public housing, airports, 185 hospitals, terminals, docks, parking facilities, or charitable, cultural, educational, recreational, conservation, sport, curative, corrective, detentional, penal, and medical 186 187 institutions, agencies, and facilities; to provide for any other public improvements inside 188 or outside the corporate limits of the city; to regulate the use of public improvements; and, 189 for such purposes, property may be acquired by condemnation under Title 22 of the 190 O.C.G.A. or such other applicable laws as are or may hereafter be enacted.
- (29) Public peace. To provide for the prevention and punishment of drunkenness, riots,and public disturbances.
- (30) Public transportation. To organize and operate such public transportation systems asare deemed beneficial.
- (31) Public utilities and services. To grant franchises or make contracts for public utilities
 and public services and to prescribe the rates, fares, regulations, and standards and
 conditions of service applicable to the service to be provided by the franchise grantee or
 contractor, insofar as not in conflict with valid regulations of the Public Service
 Commission.
- (32) Regulation of roadside areas. To prohibit or regulate and control the erection,
 removal, and maintenance of signs, billboards, trees, shrubs, fences, buildings, and any and
 all other structures or obstructions upon or adjacent to the rights-of-way of streets and

roads or within view thereof, inside or abutting the corporate limits of the city and toprescribe penalties and punishment for violation of such ordinances.

205 (33) Retirement. To provide and maintain a retirement plan for officers and employees206 of the City of Grayson.

(34) Roadways. To lay out, open, extend, widen, narrow, establish or change the grade
of, abandon or close, construct, pave, curb, gutter, adorn with shade trees, or otherwise
improve, maintain, repair, clean, prevent erosion of, and light the roads, alleys, and
walkways within the corporate limits of the city; and to grant franchises and rights-of-way
throughout the streets and roads and over the bridges and viaducts for the use of public
utilities; and to require real estate owners to repair and maintain in a safe condition the
sidewalks adjoining their lots or lands and to impose penalties for failure to do so.

(35) Sewer fees. To levy a fee, charge, or sewer tax as necessary to assure the acquiring, constructing, equipping, operating, maintaining, and extending of a sewage disposal plant and sewerage system; to levy on those to whom sewers and sewerage systems are made available a sewer service fee, charge, or tax for the availability or use of the sewers; to provide for the manner and method of collecting such service charge and for enforcing payment of the same; and to charge, impose, and collect a sewer connection fee or fees to those connected with the system.

- (36) Solid waste disposal. To provide for the collection and disposal of garbage, rubbish,
 and refuse and to regulate the collection and disposal of garbage, rubbish, and refuse by
 others including the granting of exclusive or nonexclusive franchises for such services; and
 to provide for the separate collection of glass, tin, aluminum, cardboard, paper, and other
 recyclable materials and provide for the sale of such items.
- (37) Special areas of public regulation. To regulate junk dealers and pawn shops; to 226 227 regulate the manufacture, sale, or transportation of intoxicating liquors, and the use and 228 sale of firearms; to regulate the transportation, storage, and use of combustible, explosive, 229 and inflammable materials, the use of lighting and heating equipment, and any other business or situation which may be dangerous to persons or property; to regulate and 230 231 control the conduct of peddlers and itinerant traders, theatrical performances, exhibitions, 232 and shows of any kind by taxation or otherwise; and to regulate professional fortunetelling, palmistry, adult bookstores, adult entertainment establishments, tattoo parlors and massage 233 234 parlors.
- (38) Special assessments. To levy and provide for the collection of special assessmentsto cover the costs of any public improvements.
- 237 (39) Taxes: ad valorem. To levy and provide for the assessment, valuation, revaluation,
- and collection of taxes on all property subject to taxation.

- (40) Taxes: other. To levy and collect such other taxes as may be allowed now or in thefuture by law.
- (41) Taxicabs. To regulate and license vehicles operated for hire in the city; to limit the
 number of such vehicles; to require the operators thereof to be licensed; to require public
 liability insurance on such vehicles in the amounts to be prescribed by ordinance; and to
 regulate the parking of such vehicles.
- 245 (42) Urban redevelopment. To organize and operate an urban redevelopment program.
- (43) Other powers. To exercise and enjoy all other powers, functions, rights, privileges, 246 247 and immunities necessary or desirable to promote or protect the safety, health, peace, security, good order, comfort, convenience, or general welfare of the city and its 248 inhabitants; to exercise all implied powers necessary to carry into execution all powers 249 granted in this charter as fully and completely as if such powers were fully stated in this 250 charter; and to exercise all powers now or in the future authorized to be exercised by other 251 252 municipal governments under other laws of the State of Georgia; and no listing of particular powers in this charter shall be held to be exclusive of others, nor restrictive of 253 general words and phrases granting powers, but shall be held to be in addition to such 254 powers unless expressly prohibited to municipalities under the Constitution or applicable 255 256 laws of the State of Georgia.
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SECTION 1.14.

Exercise of powers.
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All powers, functions, rights, privileges, and immunities of the city, its officers, agencies, or employees shall be carried into execution as provided by this charter. If this charter makes no provision, such shall be carried into execution as provided by ordinance or as provided by pertinent laws of the State of Georgia.

SECTION 1.15.

264 Ordinances.

All ordinances, bylaws, rules and regulations now in force in the city not inconsistent with this charter are hereby declared valid and of full effect and force until amended or repealed by the governing authority.

271	SECTION 2.10.
272	City council creation; number; election.
273	(a) The legislative authority of the government of this city, except as otherwise specifically

provided in this charter, shall be vested in a city council to be composed of a mayor and four
councilmembers. The mayor and councilmembers shall be elected in the manner provided
by general law and by Article V of this charter.

(b) Any person desiring to offer as a candidate for mayor shall specify that he or she isseeking the office of mayor.

(c) For the purpose of electing the four councilmembers of the city, there shall be four
council posts to be designated Council Post 1 through Council Post 4. Any person desiring
to offer as a candidate for councilmember shall designate the council post for which he or she
is offering.

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SECTION 2.11.

Terms and qualifications for office.

(a) The four members of the city council shall serve for terms of two years and until their
respective successors are elected and qualified. The councilmembers who hold Council
Posts 1 and 3 shall be elected in even years. The mayor and councilmembers who hold
Council Posts 2 and 4 shall be elected in odd years.

(b) No person shall be eligible to serve as mayor or councilmember unless the person shall
have been a resident of the city for a period of one year preceding the date of the election of
the mayor or members of the city council and must be a qualified voter in municipal elections
for officers of said city; the mayor or councilmember shall continue to reside therein during
their period of service and to be registered and qualified to vote in municipal elections of this
city.

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SECTION 2.12.

Election of mayor; forfeiture; compensation.

The mayor shall be elected for and shall serve for a term of two years and until his or her successor is elected and qualified. The mayor shall be a qualified elector of this city and shall have been a resident of the city for one year immediately preceding his or her election.

The mayor shall continue to reside in this city during the period of his or her service. The mayor shall forfeit his or her office on the same grounds and under the same procedure as for councilmembers. The compensation of the mayor shall be established in the same manner as for councilmembers.
 SECTION 2.13.
 Powers and duties of mayor.

306 (a) The mayor shall:

307 (1) Preside at all meetings of the city council;

308 (2) Be the head of the city for the purpose of service of process and for ceremonial

309 purposes and be the official spokesman for the city and the chief advocate of policy;

310 (3) Have the power to administer oaths and to take affidavits;

311 (4) Sign as a matter of course on behalf of the city, as approved by or in accordance with

312 council authorization, all written and approved contracts, and other instruments executed

313 by the city which by law are required to be in writing;

314 (5) Vote on matters before the city council only in the case of a tie vote;

315 (6) Prepare and submit to the city council a recommended annual operating budget and316 recommended capital budget;

317 (7) Require any department or agency of the city to submit written reports whenever the

318 mayor deems it expedient;

(8) Recommend to the city council such measures relative to the affairs of the city,

improvement of the government, and promotion of the welfare of its inhabitants as the

321 mayor may be expedient;

322 (9) Fulfill such other executive and administrative duties as the city council shall by

323 ordinance establish; and

324 (10) Perform such other duties as may be required by law, this charter, or by ordinance.

325

SECTION 2.14.

326 Organizational meetings.

327 The city council shall hold an organizational meeting on the third Monday in March of each

328 year. The meeting shall be called to order by the city clerk and the oath of the office shall329 be administered to the newly elected members as follows:

"I do solemnly swear or affirm that I will faithfully perform all of the duties of (mayor)
(councilmember) of the City of Grayson in Gwinnett County, Georgia, according to the

best of my ability and understanding, so help me God. I further swear or affirm that I am

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333 not the holder of any unaccounted for public money due to this state or any political subdivision or authority thereof; that I am not the holder of any office of trust under the 334 335 government of the United States, any other state, or any foreign state which I am by the 336 laws of the State of Georgia prohibited from holding; that I am otherwise qualified to hold the office of (mayor) (councilmember) according to the Constitution and laws of the State 337 338 of Georgia; that I am a resident of the City of Grayson, Georgia, and have been a resident 339 for the period required by law; that I will support and defend the charter thereof as well as the Constitution and laws of the State of Georgia and of the United States of America." 340

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SECTION 2.15.

342 Mayor pro tempore.

By a majority vote, at the first regular meeting of the mayor and council in March of each 343 year, the mayor and council shall elect a councilmember to serve as the mayor pro tempore. 344 345 The mayor pro tempore shall assume the duties and powers of the mayor during the mayor's 346 disability or absence. If the mayor pro tempore is absent because of sickness or disqualification, any one of the remaining councilmembers, chosen by the members present, 347 348 shall be clothed with all the rights and privileges of the mayor and shall perform the mayor's 349 duties.

- 350 **SECTION 2.16.**
- 351

Regular and special meetings.

(a) The city council shall hold regular meetings at such times and places as prescribed by 352

353 ordinance. The council may recess any regular meeting and continue such meetings on any

354 date or hour it may fix and may transact any business at such continued meeting as may be

transacted at any regular meeting. 355

(b) The mayor and city council may hold special meetings and may transact business therein 356

in accordance with law. 357

- (c) All meetings of the city council may be public in accordance with applicable law. 358
- 359

SECTION 2.17.

360

Rules of procedure.

(a) The city council shall adopt rules of procedure and order of business consistent with the 361 provisions of this charter and shall provide for keeping a journal of its proceedings which 362

shall be a public record. 363

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(b) All committees and committee chairmen and officers of the city council, if any, shall be
appointed by the mayor and shall serve at the pleasure of the mayor. The mayor shall have
the power to appoint new members to any committee at any time.

367

SECTION 2.18.

368 Quorum; voting.

The mayor, or mayor pro tempore, and two councilmembers shall constitute a quorum and shall be authorized to transact the business of the city council. Voting on the adoption of ordinances may be by voice vote and the vote shall be recorded in the journal, but any member of the city council shall have the right to request a roll-call vote and such vote shall be recorded in the journal. Except as otherwise provided in this charter, the affirmative vote of the majority of the members present shall be required for the adoption of any ordinance, resolution, or motion.

SECTION 2.19.

377 Vacancies; forfeiture of office; filling of vacancies.

- 378 (a) The office of mayor or councilmember shall become vacant upon the incumbent's death,
- 379 resignation, forfeiture of office, or removal from office in any manner authorized by this380 charter or the general laws of the State of Georgia.
- 381 (b) The mayor or any councilmember shall forfeit office if he or she:
- 382 (1) Lacks at any time during the term of office any qualification of the office as prescribed
- 383 by this charter or the laws of the State of Georgia; or
- 384 (2) Is convicted of a felony involving moral turpitude.

385 (c) A vacancy in the office of mayor or councilmember shall be filled for the remainder of

386 the unexpired term, if any, as provided for in this charter.

387

SECTION 2.20.

388

Grounds and procedure for removal.

- (a) The mayor or any councilmember shall be subject to removal from office for any one or
- 390 more of the following causes:
- 391 (1) Incompetence, misfeasance, or malfeasance in office;
- 392 (2) Conviction of a crime involving moral turpitude;
- 393 (3) Failure at any time to possess any of the qualifications of office, as provided by this
- charter or by law;

395 (4) Willful violation of any express prohibition of this charter;

396 (5) Abandonment of office or neglect to perform the duties thereof; or

- 397 (6) Failure for any other cause to perform the duties of office as required by this charter398 or by law.
- (b) Removal of an elected officer from office may be accomplished by one of the followingmethods:

401 (1) By action of two-thirds' vote of the entire membership of the council. In the event an 402 elected officer is sought to be removed by the action of the council, such officer shall be 403 entitled to a written notice specifying the ground for removal and to a public hearing which shall be held not less than ten days after the service of such written notice. Any elected 404 officer sought to be removed from office as herein provided shall have the right to appeal 405 from the decision of the council to the Superior Court of Gwinnett County. Such appeal 406 shall be governed by the same rules as govern appeals to the superior court from the 407 probate court; or 408

409 (2) By information filed in the Superior Court of Gwinnett County, as provided by law.

- 410 SECTION 2.21.
 411 Compensation and expenses.

412 The mayor and councilmembers shall receive compensation and expenses for their services413 as provided by ordinance.

- 414 SECTION 2.22.

The budget shall be accompanied by a message from the mayor 838 containing a statement of the general fiscal policies of the city, the important features of the 839 840 budget, explanations of major changes recommended for the next fiscal year, a general summary of the budget, and such other comments and information as he or she may deem 841 pertinent. The operating budget and the capital improvements budget hereinafter provided 842 for, the budget message, and all supporting documents shall be filed with the office of the 843 city clerk and shall be open to public inspection. 844

846	Action by city council on budget.
847	(a) The city council may amend the operating budget proposed by the mayor, except that the
848	budget as finally amended and adopted must provide for all expenditures required by law or
849	by other provisions of this charter and for all debt service requirements for the ensuing fiscal

The taxes and tax rates set by such ordinance shall be such that reasonable estimates of revenues from such levy shall at least be sufficient, together with other anticipated revenues, fund balances, and applicable reserves, to equal the total amount appropriated for each of the several funds set forth in the annual operating budget for defraying the expense of the general government of this city.

874 Changes in appropriations.

The city council, by ordinance, may make changes in the appropriations contained in the current operating budget at any regular meeting or special or emergency meeting called for

such purpose, but any additional appropriations may be made only from an existing 877 878 unappropriated surplus.

Capital improvements budget.

On or before a date fixed by the city council but not later than 60 days prior to the beginning 881 of each fiscal year, the mayor shall submit to the city council a proposed capital 882 883 improvements budget with his or her recommendations as to the means of financing the 884 improvements proposed for the ensuing fiscal year. The city council shall have the power to accept, with or without amendments, or reject the proposed program and proposed means 885 of financing. The city council shall not authorize an expenditure for the construction of any 886 building, structure, work, or improvement, unless the appropriations for such project are 887 included in the capital improvements budget, except to meet a public emergency threatening 888 the lives, health, or property of the inhabitants, when passed by a two-thirds' vote of the 889 membership of the council. 890

892 Independent audit.

893 There shall be an annual independent audit of all city accounts, funds, and financial 894 transactions by a certified public accountant selected by the city council. The audit shall be 895 conducted according to generally accepted accounting principles. Copies of all audit reports shall be available at printing cost to the public.
