

## Senate Resolution 223

## A RESOLUTION

1 Recognizing and commending Major General Thomas R. Moore; and for other purposes.

2 WHEREAS, our nation's security continues to rely on patriotic men and women who put  
3 their personal lives on hold in order to place themselves in harm's way to protect the  
4 freedoms that all United States citizens cherish; and

5 WHEREAS, Major General Thomas R. Moore serves as the commander of the Air National  
6 Guard at Dobbins Air Reserve Base where he supervises the Georgia State Air Guard staff  
7 and commands 2,844 Georgia Air Guard members that serve in two flying wings, seven  
8 geographically separated units, and a Combat Readiness Training Center; and

9 WHEREAS, Major General Moore earned a bachelor's degree from the University of South  
10 Carolina and a master's degree from Webster University; has attended Squadron Officer  
11 School, Air Command and Staff College, and Air War College; and completed a Leadership  
12 in Crisis Course and a Joint Task Force Commanders Course; and

13 WHEREAS, he has more than 3,500 flying hours in the T-37, KC-135A/R, B-1B, C-130H,  
14 and E-8C; and

15 WHEREAS, Major General Moore received his commission in 1981 and has commanded  
16 at the squadron, group, and wing levels and twice served as Commander of the 416th Air  
17 Expeditionary Group in Southwest Asia; and

18 WHEREAS, he has been recognized with numerous honors and awards for his service to this  
19 nation, including a Legion of Merit, a Bronze Star Medal with one oak leaf cluster, a  
20 Meritorious Service Medal with two oak leaf clusters, an Air Force Commendation Medal  
21 with one oak leaf cluster, an Air Force Achievement Medal, and an Air Force Outstanding  
22 Unit Award with V device and three oak leaf clusters; and

23 WHEREAS, Major General Moore embodies the spirit of service, willing to find meaning  
24 in something greater than himself while serving as a guardian of this nation's freedom, and  
25 it is abundantly fitting and proper that the outstanding accomplishments of this remarkable  
26 and distinguished American be recognized appropriately.

27 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that the members of this body  
28 commend Major General Thomas R. Moore for his deep personal commitment to protecting  
29 democracy and recognize the selfless service he has made to this country.

30 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Secretary of the Senate is authorized and directed  
31 to transmit an appropriate copy of this resolution to Major General Thomas R. Moore.
