

## Senate Resolution 238

## A RESOLUTION

1 Expressing support and respect for the United Nations Security Council Resolution 1962  
2 which was adopted unanimously on December 20, 2010, recognizing Dr. Alassane Ouattara  
3 as the democratically elected President of Côte d'Ivoire; and for other purposes.

4 WHEREAS, global democracy is a universal goal of all democratically elected officials, be  
5 they local, state, or federal; and

6 WHEREAS, the State of Georgia is the home of over 4,000 Ivoirians who contribute to the  
7 Georgia economy as professionals, employers, and supporters of a transparent democracy;  
8 and

9 WHEREAS, in October and November, 2010, Côte d'Ivoire held two rounds of presidential  
10 elections which were monitored by the Carter Center, which is based in Georgia, the  
11 Economic Community of West African States, the United Nations, and the African Union,  
12 among other internationally recognized bodies; and

13 WHEREAS, according to Phillip Carter III, the United States Ambassador to Côte d'Ivoire,  
14 Dr. Alassane Ouattara was clearly and undisputedly elected President of Côte d'Ivoire, with  
15 an 8.2 percent lead of all votes cast from polling venues around the world, including several  
16 in the United States and one in Georgia; and

17 WHEREAS, defeated former President Laurent Gbagbo refuses to respect the will of the  
18 people of Côte d'Ivoire and the will of the Economic Community of West African States  
19 delegation from West African countries, the African Union, a number of nongovernmental  
20 organizations, the United States, and other sovereign governments to step down as president;  
21 and

22 WHEREAS, as a result of former president Gbagdo's refusal to relinquish the presidency,  
23 there are credible reports of militia groups loyal to Gbagdo roaming neighborhoods largely

24 populated by Ouattara supporters and forcing people from their homes, resulting in some  
25 being beaten, tortured, and executed, and some have even disappeared, and according to the  
26 UN Human Rights Division, an investigation into the deaths of over 500 Ivorians killed by  
27 Gbagdo loyalists has resulted in the identification of over four mass grave sites.

28 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that the members of this body  
29 express support and respect for the United Nations Security Council Resolution 1962 which  
30 was adopted unanimously on December 20, 2010, recognizing Dr. Alassane Ouattara, who  
31 was designated an Honorary Citizen of Georgia in 2000, as the democratically elected  
32 President of Côte d'Ivoire.

33 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Secretary of the Senate is authorized and directed  
34 to transmit an appropriate copy of this resolution to the public and the press.
