

LOST

Senators Shafer of the 48th and McKoon of the 29th offered the following amendment:

1 *Amend SB 10 by adding after "procedures;" on line 10 the following:* to provide for a process
2 for nullification of the prior election results;

3 *By inserting "for any period of time" after "Sundays" on lines 5, 9, 22, 25, 38, 40, 42, 44, 50,*
4 *60, 68, 81, 84, 86, 89, and 95.*

6 *By redesignating paragraph (3) on lines 50 and 95 as paragraph (6) and paragraph (4) on*
7 *lines 54 and 99 as paragraph (7); and adding between lines 49 and 50 the following:*

8 (3) If the election held pursuant to paragraph (2) of this subsection results in the approval
9 of the sale of malt beverages and wine for any period of time on Sundays from 12:30 P.M.
10 to 11:30 P.M., the governing authority of the county or municipality shall be authorized to
11 provide by the issuance of licenses and the passage of resolutions or ordinances all
12 provisions concerning such sales on Sunday under this subsection, except where otherwise
13 provided by state law. The governing authority shall at any time be authorized to adjust
14 the period between 12:30 P.M. and 11:30 P.M. during which such sales on Sunday may be
15 permitted within its jurisdiction by the adoption of an appropriate resolution or ordinance.

16 (4) Following the expiration of one year after any election is held which results in the
17 disapproval of the sale of malt beverages and wine for any period on Sundays from 12:30
18 P.M. to 11:30 P.M., another election on this question may be held if the governing
19 authority, as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, forwards a proper resolution or
20 ordinance to the election superintendent calling for such a referendum.

21 (5) In any county or municipality which has at any time held an election in accordance
22 with paragraph (2) of this subsection resulting in the majority of the votes being cast in
23 favor of the sale of malt beverages and wine for any period of time from 12:30 P.M. to
24 11:30 P.M. on Sundays under this subsection, the election superintendent of the county or
25 municipality, upon receipt of the proper resolution or ordinance of the governing authority
26 or upon the receipt of a written petition signed by at least 35 percent of the registered
27 qualified voters of the county or municipality, shall proceed to call another election for the
28 purpose of nullifying the previous election in the same manner as prescribed in paragraph
29 (2) of this subsection.

30 *By adding between lines 94 and 95 the following:*

31 (3) If the election held pursuant to paragraph (2) of this subsection results in the approval
32 of the sale of malt beverages, wine, and distilled spirits for any period of time on Sundays
33 from 12:30 P.M. to 11:30 P.M., the governing authority of the county or municipality shall
34 be authorized to provide by the issuance of licenses and the passage of resolutions or
35 ordinances all provisions all provisions concerning such sales on Sunday under this
36 subsection, except where otherwise provided by state law. The governing authority shall
37 at any time be authorized to adjust the period between 12:30 P.M. and 11:30 P.M. during
38 which such sales on Sunday may be permitted within its jurisdiction by the adoption of an
39 appropriate resolution or ordinance.

40 (4) Following the expiration of one year after any election is held which results in the
41 disapproval of the sale of malt beverages, wine and distilled spirits for any period on
42 Sundays from 12:30 P.M. to 11:30 P.M., another election on this question may be held if
43 the governing authority, as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, forwards a proper
44 resolution or ordinance to the election superintendent calling for such a referendum.

45 (5) In any county or municipality which has at any time held an election in accordance
46 with paragraph (2) of this subsection resulting in the majority of the votes being cast in
47 favor of the sale of malt beverages, wine, and distilled spirits for any period of time from
48 12:30 P.M. to 11:30 P.M. on Sundays under this subsection, the election superintendent of
49 the county or municipality, upon receipt of the proper resolution or ordinance of the
50 governing authority or upon the receipt of a written petition signed by at least 35 percent
51 of the registered qualified voters of the county or municipality, shall proceed to call another
52 election for the purpose of nullifying the previous election in the same manner as
53 prescribed in paragraph (2) of this subsection.
