Senators Shafer of the 48th, Hill of the 32nd and McKoon of the 29th offered the following amendment to Amendment #1 to SB 10:

1 *Amend SB 10 by redesignating paragraph (3) on lines 50 and 95 as paragraph (6) and*
 2 *paragraph (4) on lines 54 and 99 as paragraph (7); and adding between lines 49 and 50 the*
 3 *following: (3) If the election held pursuant to paragraph (2) of this subsection results in the*
 4 *approval of the sale of malt beverages and wine for any period of time on Sundays from*
 5 *12:30 P.M. to 11:30 P.M., the governing authority of the county or municipality shall be*
 6 *authorized to provide by the issuance of licenses and the passage of resolutions or ordinances*
 7 *all provisions concerning such sales on Sunday under this subsection, except where*
 8 *otherwise provided by state law. The governing authority shall at any time be authorized to*
 9 *adjust the period between 12:30 P.M. and 11:30 P.M. during which such sales on Sunday*
 10 *may be permitted within its jurisdiction by the adoption of an appropriate resolution or*
 11 *ordinance. (4) Following the expiration of one year after any election is held which results*
 12 *in the disapproval of the sale of malt beverages and wine for any period on Sundays from*
 13 *12:30 P.M. to 11:30 P.M., another election on this question may be held if the governing*
 14 *authority, as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, forwards a proper resolution or*
 15 *ordinance to the election superintendent calling for such a referendum. (5) In any county*
 16 *or municipality which has at any time held an election in accordance with paragraph (2) of*
 17 *this subsection resulting in the majority of the votes being cast in favor of the sale of malt*
 18 *beverages and wine for any period of time from 12:30 P.M. to 11:30 P.M. on Sundays under*
 19 *this subsection, the election superintendent of the county or municipality, upon receipt of the*
 20 *proper resolution or ordinance of the governing authority or upon the receipt of a written*
 21 *petition signed by at least 35 percent of the registered qualified voters of the county or*
 22 *municipality, shall proceed to call another election for the purpose of nullifying the previous*
 23 *election in the same manner as prescribed in paragraph (2) of this subsection.*

24 *By adding between lines 94 and 95 the following: (3) If the election held pursuant to*
 25 *paragraph (2) of this subsection results in the approval of the sale of malt beverages, wine,*
 26 *and distilled spirits for any period of time on Sundays from 12:30 P.M. to 11:30 P.M., the*
 27 *governing authority of the county or municipality shall be authorized to provide by the*
 28 *issuance of licenses and the passage of resolutions or ordinances all provisions all provisions*
 29 *concerning such sales on Sunday under this subsection, except where otherwise provided by*
 30 *state law. The governing authority shall at any time be authorized to adjust the period*

31 between 12:30 P.M. and 11:30 P.M. during which such sales on Sunday may be permitted
32 within its jurisdiction by the adoption of an appropriate resolution or ordinance.
33 (4) Following the expiration of one year after any election is held which results in the
34 disapproval of the sale of malt beverages, wine and distilled spirits for any period on Sundays
35 from 12:30 P.M. to 11:30 P.M., another election on this question may be held if the
36 governing authority, as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, forwards a proper
37 resolution or ordinance to the election superintendent calling for such a referendum. (5) In
38 any county or municipality which has at any time held an election in accordance with
39 paragraph (2) of this subsection resulting in the majority of the votes being cast in favor of
40 the sale of malt beverages, wine, and distilled spirits for any period of time from 12:30 P.M.
41 to 11:30 P.M. on Sundays under this subsection, the election superintendent of the county
42 or municipality, upon receipt of the proper resolution or ordinance of the governing authority
43 or upon the receipt of a written petition signed by at least 35 percent of the registered
44 qualified voters of the county or municipality, shall proceed to call another election for the
45 purpose of nullifying the previous election in the same manner as prescribed in paragraph (2)
46 of this subsection.
