

## House Resolution 643

## A RESOLUTION

- 1 Creating the House Study Committee on the Equine Industry; and for other purposes.
- 2 WHEREAS, the State of Georgia has significant amounts of pastureland and facilities that  
3 would allow for the breeding, raising, training, and stabling of horses; and
- 4 WHEREAS, the State of Georgia's economy would benefit from an expansion of the equine  
5 industry in Georgia; and
- 6 WHEREAS, the State of Georgia would receive broad financial benefits from additional  
7 employment opportunities, the investment of additional capital, and the realization of profits  
8 from the breeding, raising, and quartering of horses and the possibility of pari-mutuel  
9 wagering and training and racing horses at tracks in this state; and
- 10 WHEREAS, the financial and other implications of such an expansion of Georgia's equine  
11 industry deserve to be considered and studied.
- 12 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that  
13 there is created the House Study Committee on the Equine Industry to be composed of six  
14 members. Three members shall be members of the House of Representatives, two members  
15 shall be citizens of the state, and one member shall be an individual who is involved in the  
16 horse racing industry. Each member shall be appointed by the Speaker of the House of  
17 Representatives. The Speaker shall designate one of the House members of the committee  
18 to be the chairperson of the committee. The chairperson shall call all meetings of the  
19 committee. In the event that the Senate has a similar study committee, the committee shall  
20 be authorized to conduct meetings jointly with the Senate committee and to collaborate with  
21 the Senate committee in studying the above issues and determining what actions or  
22 legislation should be recommended.

23 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the committee shall undertake a study of the above  
24 issues and recommend any actions or legislation that the committee deems necessary or  
25 appropriate. The committee may conduct such meetings at such places and at such times as  
26 it may deem necessary or convenient to enable it to exercise fully and effectively its powers,  
27 perform its duties, and accomplish the objectives and purposes of this resolution. The  
28 members of the committee shall receive the allowances authorized for legislative members  
29 of interim legislative committees but shall receive the same for not more than five days  
30 unless additional days are authorized. The funds necessary to carry out the provisions of this  
31 resolution shall come from the funds appropriated to the House of Representatives. The  
32 committee shall publish a report of its findings and recommendations which may include  
33 suggestions for proposed legislation. Such report shall be made on or before December 31,  
34 2011. The committee shall stand abolished on December 31, 2011.
