6 struck a child who was crossing the street with her sister; and

7 WHEREAS, nine year old Anaiah Rucker had bravely pushed her younger sister, Camry, to
8 safety but she was struck in the process and lay unconscious in the road; and

9 WHEREAS, Ms. Berryman's quick thinking and steady nerves allowed her to perform CPR
10 on Anaiah, helping the child regain her breathing prior to the arrival of EMS; and

11 WHEREAS, thanks to Ms. Berryman's actions, Anaiah survived the horrific accident and is
12 home today with her appreciative and loving sister; and

13 WHEREAS, it is only fitting and proper that this body recognize the courageous and selfless
14 actions of this brave hero.

15 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that
16 the members of this body commend Ms. Loretta Berryman for her courageous and
17 quick-thinking action that saved the life of a young Georgian.
