## A RESOLUTION

- 1 Urging Congress to expand the eligibility requirements of the H-2A guest worker program;
- 2 and for other purposes.
- 3 WHEREAS, Georgia's agricultural industry continues to shine as this state's top economic
- 4 driver; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Georgia has almost 48,000 farms consisting of over 10 million acres, but
- 6 farmers make up only a small fraction of the thousands of Georgians who earn a living in
- 7 agriculture and agribusiness; and
- 8 WHEREAS, agricultural business in Georgia is estimated to bring in \$68 billion; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Georgia's agriculture industry is the primary source of employment in this state,
- 10 with one in seven employed in agriculture, forestry, or other related field, including
- processing, shipping, retail, agricultural dealers and suppliers, and tourism; and
- 12 WHEREAS, the H-2A guest worker program is only available to producers with work needs
- of a temporary or seasonal nature, but due to the year-round nature of some industries within
- 14 agriculture, this provision prohibits these, specifically the dairy, poultry, livestock, and
- 15 ginning industries, from being eligible; and
- 16 WHEREAS, the H-2A program is currently administered by the United States Department
- 17 of Labor; and
- 18 WHEREAS, the current program under the United States Department of Labor is
- 19 inefficiently run, and there is currently federal legislation in the House that better places the
- 20 program within the United States Department of Agriculture; and

21 WHEREAS, building on successes of existing state and federal partnerships, State

- 22 Departments of Agriculture should be considered as cooperating partners in the
- 23 administration of a federal guest worker program.
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that the members of this body
- 25 urge Congress to allow states to administer their own H-2A guest worker programs through
- 26 the monitoring of the United States Department of Agriculture.
- 27 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Secretary of the Senate is authorized and directed
- 28 to transmit an appropriate copy of this resolution to Congress.
