A RESOLUTION

1 Recognizing September, 2012, as Childhood Cancer Awareness Month; and for other

2 purposes.

WHEREAS, children are the world's most precious resource, providing hope for the future
and representing innocence, happiness, and joy; and

5 WHEREAS, cancer is the second leading cause of death for America's children and the most

6 prevalent fatal disease that America's children endure; and

WHEREAS, on any given school day, approximately 50 children will be diagnosed with
cancer, and more than 12,500 children are diagnosed every year; and

9 WHEREAS, one in 330 Americans will develop cancer before his or her 20th birthday, and

10 each year more than 3,000 children will lose their lives to cancer; and

11 WHEREAS, this year, approximately 400 children in the State of Georgia will be diagnosed

12 with some form of cancer each month; and

WHEREAS, since 2006, Jay's HOPE has provided support to over 800 children affected bycancer in the State of Georgia; and

15 WHEREAS, this body recognizes the devastating effects of cancer on children and 16 encourages childhood cancer awareness and the promotion of early detection and education.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that the members of this body
recognize September, 2012, as Childhood Cancer Awareness Month.
