### A RESOLUTION

1 Honoring the life and memory of Fredrick Howard Hines; and for other purposes.

2 WHEREAS, the State of Georgia mourns the loss of one of its most distinguished citizens  
3 with the passing of Fredrick H. Hines on January 16, 2012; and

4 WHEREAS, Fredrick was born on February 21, 1941, a beloved son of Julian and Irene  
5 Hines; and

6 WHEREAS, he served as a guardian of this nation's freedom and liberty with the United  
7 States Navy, valiantly and courageously protecting his fellow Americans from 1960 to 1964  
8 as a radarman on the commissioning crew of the U.S.S. *Kitty Hawk*; and

9 WHEREAS, he was united in love and marriage to DeAnna Hines, and was blessed with four  
10 remarkable children, Caprice Huntzinger, Jason Hines, Tracy Mitchell, and Timothy Hines;  
11 13 wonderful grandchildren, Tyler Kay, Lauren Bland, Kelly, Ashley, and Kyle Huntzinger,  
12 Nicholas, Cody, and Heather Hines, Jessica and Morgan Mitchell, Carson and Juliann

14 WHEREAS, he received his bachelor's degree in Education and a master's degree in School  
15 Counseling from Indiana University; and

16 WHEREAS, in Indiana he taught math and science at Brown County Junior High School,  
17 was a counselor at Hoosier Hills Career Center, Cloverdale Middle School, and Cloverdale  
18 High School, and in Georgia he was a counselor at Lilburn Middle School, Youth  
19 Elementary School, and Heard-Mixon Elementary School; and

20 WHEREAS, he was an active member of the Indiana University Alumni Association,  
21 Georgia State University Alumni Association, U.S.S. *Kitty Hawk* Veterans Association, and  
22 served on the Advisory Board for the Rialto Center for the Arts at Georgia State University

23 and was a member of the Panther Athletic Club at Georgia State and the American Legion

25 WHEREAS, he was a person of magnanimous strengths with an unimpeachable reputation  
26 for integrity, intelligence, fairness, and kindness and, by the example he made of his life, he

29 love of family and friendship, and this loyal son, husband, father, grandfather,  
30 great-grandfather, and friend will be missed by all who had the great fortune of knowing him.
