## A RESOLUTION

- 1 Honoring the life and memory of Carol Hudson Eure, Sr.; and for other purposes.
- 2 WHEREAS, the State of Georgia mourns the loss of one of its most distinguished citizens  
3 with the passing of Carol Hudson Eure, Sr., on October 10, 2011; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Carol was born on September 18, 1926, in Tunis, North Carolina, a beloved son  
5 of Opal and Claude Eure; and
- 6 WHEREAS, he served as a guardian of this nation's freedom and liberty with the United  
7 States Navy, valiantly and courageously protecting his fellow Americans in the Pacific  
8 during World War II; and
- 9 WHEREAS, a man of deep and abiding faith, Carol was an active member of First  
10 Presbyterian Church, where he organized, led, and taught The Strugglers Sunday school class  
11 for 35 years; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Carol was united in love and marriage to the late Mary Elizabeth Wolfe, with  
13 whom he not only raised six remarkable children, Jamie Eure Buffington, Abbie Eure Joy,  
14 Stevie Eure Doss, Carol Hudson Eure, Jr., Lee Ellen Eure King, and LeeAnn Eure DeCastro,  
15 but also fostered approximately 100 children; and
- 16 WHEREAS, his community involvement was further evidenced by his membership on  
17 numerous boards, including the Chamber of Commerce, Brenau University, and Gainesville  
18 City Schools, among many others; and
- 19 WHEREAS, he gave inspiration to many through his high ideals, morals, and deep concern  
20 for his fellow citizens, and the devotion, patience, and understanding he demonstrated to his  
21 family and friends were admired by others; and

22 WHEREAS, he was a person of magnanimous strengths with an unimpeachable reputation  
23 for integrity, intelligence, fairness, and kindness, and by the example he made of his life, he  
24 made this world a better place in which to live; and

25 WHEREAS, a compassionate and generous man, Carol Hudson Eure, Sr., will long be  
26 remembered for his love of family, friendship, and community, and this loyal husband, son,  
27 father, and friend will be missed by all who had the great fortune of knowing him.

28 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that  
29 the members of this body join in honoring the life and memory of Carol Hudson Eure, Sr.,
