AS PASSED SENATE

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

1 To amend Chapter 5 of Title 6 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to the 2 Georgia Aviation Authority, so as to provide for the transfer of certain personnel, aircraft, and other assets from the Georgia Aviation Authority to the Department of Natural 3 4 Resources and the State Forestry Commission; to provide for related matters; to amend Title 12 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to conservation and natural resources, 5 so as to transfer certain personnel, assets, and liabilities of the Georgia Aviation Authority 6 7 to the Department of Natural Resources and the State Forestry Commission; to provide the Department of Natural Resources and the State Forestry Commission with certain authority 8 9 and duties with regard to aviation; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; 10 and for other purposes.

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

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12	SECTION 1.
13	Chapter 5 of Title 6 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to the Georgia
14	Aviation Authority, is amended by revising Code Section 6-5-4, relating to the purpose of
15	the authority, powers, support, and annual audits, as follows:
16	<i>"</i> 6-5-4.
17	(a)(1)(A) The general purpose of the authority shall be to acquire, operate, maintain,
18	house, and dispose of all state aviation assets, except those aviation assets of the
19	Department of Public Safety, to provide aviation services and oversight of state aircraft
20	and aviation operations to ensure the safety of state air travelers and aviation property,
21	to achieve policy objectives through aviation missions, and to provide for the efficient
22	operation of state aircraft.
23	(B) This Code section shall not diminish those powers and duties of the Department
24	of Natural Resources under Code Section 12-2-11, the State Forestry Commission
25	under Code Section 12-6-25, or the Department of Public Safety under Code Section
26	<u>35-2-140.</u>

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(2)(A) All aircraft previously transferred to the authority by the Department of Public
Safety and associated parts and equipment and a percentage of the budgeted operating
funds associated with such aircraft shall be transferred on September 1, 2011, back to
the custody and control of the Department of Public Safety; provided, however, that this
chapter shall have no application to aircraft owned or operated by the Department of
Defense.

33 (B) All aircraft under the custody and control of the authority as of June 30, 2012,

which were previously transferred to the authority by the Department of Natural
 Resources and associated parts and equipment and any budgeted operating funds
 associated with such aircraft shall be transferred on July 1, 2012, back to the custody
 and control of the Department of Natural Resources.

38 (C) All aircraft under the custody and control of the authority as of June 30, 2012,
 39 which were previously transferred to the authority by the State Forestry Commission
 40 and associated parts and equipment and any budgeted operating funds associated with
 41 such aircraft shall be transferred on July 1, 2012, back to the custody and control of the

42 <u>State Forestry Commission.</u>

43 (3) On and after July 1, 2009, or a later date determined by the Governor, no other entity
44 of state government, other than the Department of Public Safety, shall acquire, lease, or
45 charter any aircraft other than through the authority.

- (4)(A) Any person who is employed by an entity of state government as a pilot and
 who is required by the terms of his or her employment to comply with the
 requirements of Chapter 8 of Title 35, the 'Georgia Peace Officer Standards and
 Training Act,' may remain in the employment of the employing agency but shall be
 transferred for administrative purposes only to the authority on July 1, 2009, in
 compliance with subsection (c) of Code Section 6-5-3; provided, however, that those
 (B) The provisions of subparagraph (A) of this paragraph notwithstanding:
- (i) Those persons who are employed by the Department of Public Safety who are
 assigned for administrative purposes only to the authority shall be transferred back to
 the Department of Public Safety on September 1, 2011, and shall no longer be under
 the administration or direction of the authority.
- 57 (ii) Any persons who as of June 30, 2012, were employed by the authority pursuant
- 58 to previous transfer from the Department of Natural Resources to the authority shall
- 59 <u>be transferred back to the Department of Natural Resources on July 1, 2012, and shall</u>
- 60 <u>no longer be under the administration or direction of the authority.</u>
- 61 (iii) Any persons who as of June 30, 2012, were employed by the authority pursuant
- 62 to previous transfer from the State Forestry Commission to the authority shall be

63	transferred back to the State Forestry Commission on July 1, 2012, and shall no
64	longer be under the administration or direction of the authority.
65	(5)(A)(i) All state aircraft required for the proper conduct of the business of the
66	several administrative departments, boards, bureaus, commissions, authorities,
67	offices, or other agencies of Georgia and authorized agents of the General Assembly,
68	or either branch thereof, and department owned airfields and their appurtenances shall
69	be managed and maintained by the authority; provided, however, that all.
70	(ii) The provisions of division (i) of this subparagraph notwithstanding:
71	(I) All airfields and appurtenances, including hangars, previously transferred by the
72	Department of Public Safety to the authority shall be transferred back to the
73	Department of Public Safety on September 1, 2011.
74	(II) All airfields and appurtenances, including hangars, previously transferred by
75	the Department of Natural Resources to the authority shall be transferred back to the
76	Department of Natural Resources on July 1, 2012.
77	(III) All airfields and appurtenances, including hangars, previously transferred by
78	the State Forestry Commission to the authority shall be transferred back to the State
79	Forestry Commission on July 1, 2012.
80	(B) The cost for the use of such state aircraft shall be charged by the authority to the
81	using state entity. The amount of such charge shall be determined by the authority.
82	(6)(A) The authority shall be authorized to dispose of any state aircraft and apply the
83	proceeds derived therefrom to the purchase of replacement aviation assets.
84	(B) This paragraph shall not apply to state aircraft assigned to the Department of Public
85	Safety, the Department of Natural Resources, or the State Forestry Commission.
86	(b) In the furtherance of its purpose, the authority shall have the power to:
87	(1) Organize, staff, Hire, organize, and train personnel to operate, maintain, house,
88	purchase, and dispose of aviation assets;
89	(2) Purchase, maintain, develop, and modify facilities to support aviation assets and
90	operations;
91	(3) Develop operating, maintenance, safety, security, training, education, and scheduling
92	standards for state aviation operations and conduct inspections, audits, and other similar
93	oversight to determine practices and compliance with such standards;
94	(4) Develop an accountability system for state aviation operations and activities;
95	(5) Identify the costs associated with the <u>training</u> , education, and purchase, operation,
96	maintenance, and administration of state aircraft and aviation operations and related
97	facilities; training, and education, develop an appropriate billing structure; and charge
98	agencies and other state entities for the costs of state aircraft and aviation operations;
99	provided, however, that any billing to an agency by the authority shall be suspended

100 whenever the Governor declares a state of emergency on any cost associated with aircraft

101 used during and in response to the state of emergency;

102 (6) Retain appropriate external consulting and auditing expertise;

103 (7) Engage aviation industry representatives to ensure best practices for state aviation104 assets;

105 (8) Delegate certain powers pursuant to this chapter to other state entities; and

106 (9) Otherwise implement appropriate and efficient management practices for state107 aviation operations.

(c)(1) The authority shall provide priority support for those state agencies and
 departments, including local and state public safety and law enforcement entities, whose
 operations require aviation operations when requested.

111 (2)(A) No state entity other than the authority and the Department of Public Safety 112 shall be authorized without the approval of the authority to expend state funds to 113 purchase, lease, rent, charter, maintain, or repair state aircraft to be used in connection 114 with state business or to employ a person whose official duties consist of piloting state 115 aircraft without the approval of the authority.

(B) This paragraph shall not apply to the Department of Public Safety, the Department
 of Natural Resources, or the State Forestry Commission.

118 (d) The funds and assets of the authority, as well as the performance of the authority, its services, and equipment, shall be audited annually by the state auditor. The initial audit 119 120 shall be concluded no later than December 30, 2010. The results of such audit shall be 121 open to inspection at reasonable times by any person. A copy of the audit report shall be sent to the state accounting officer. The authority shall also provide the Governor, the 122 Speaker of the House, the President of the Senate, the chairperson of the House Committee 123 124 on Public Safety and Homeland Security, the chairperson of the Senate Public Safety 125 Committee, the chairperson of the Senate Veterans, Military and Homeland Security Committee, the chairperson of the House Committee on Transportation, and the 126 chairperson of the Senate Transportation Committee with a copy of the state audit report 127 which shall include a full report of the activities and services of the authority. The 128 performance audit report shall be provided no later than December 31, 2013. 129

(e) On September 1, 2011, the six aviation mechanic positions that were previously
transferred by the Department of Public Safety to the authority shall be returned to the
Department of Public Safety along with the funds budgeted for such positions."

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133	SECTION 2.
134	Title 12 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to conservation and natural
135	resources, is amended in Article 1 of Chapter 2, relating to general provisions relative to the
136	Department of Natural Resources, by adding a new Code section to read as follows:
137	″ <u>12-2-11.</u>
138	(a)(1) The department shall be authorized to acquire, operate, maintain, house, and
139	dispose of all state aviation assets assigned to the department, to provide aviation services
140	and oversight of such state aircraft and aviation operations for the mission of the
141	department and legitimate state business purposes, to achieve policy objectives through
142	aviation missions, and to provide for the efficient operation of such state aircraft.
143	(2) All aircraft under the custody and control of the Georgia Aviation Authority as of
144	June 30, 2012, which were previously transferred to the authority by the department and
145	associated parts and equipment and any budgeted operating funds associated with such
146	aircraft shall be transferred on July 1, 2012, back to the custody and control of the
147	department.
148	(3) Any persons who as of June 30, 2012, were employed by the Georgia Aviation
149	Authority pursuant to previous transfer from the department to the authority shall be
150	transferred back to the department on July 1, 2012, and shall no longer be under the
151	administration or direction of the authority.
152	(4) All airfields and appurtenances, including hangars, previously transferred to the
153	Georgia Aviation Authority by the department and all accounts receivable, budgeted
154	operating funds, other funds, contracts, liabilities, and obligations associated with the
155	aircraft being transferred back to the department as of July 1, 2012, shall become the
156	property, accounts receivable, budgeted operating funds, other funds, contracts, liabilities,
157	and obligations of the department on such date.
158	(5) The department shall be responsible for providing aviation services in support of the
159	mission of the department. The department shall be authorized to dispose of any state
160	aircraft assigned to the department and apply the proceeds derived therefrom to the
161	purchase of replacement aviation assets.
162	(b) The department shall have the power to:
163	(1) Hire, organize, and train personnel to operate, maintain, house, purchase, and dispose
164	of aviation assets;
165	(2) Purchase, lease, maintain, develop, and modify facilities to support aviation assets
166	and operations;
167	(3) Develop operating, maintenance, safety, security, training, education, and scheduling
168	standards for department aviation operations and conduct inspections, audits, and other
169	similar oversight to determine practices and compliance with such standards;

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- 170 (4) Develop an accountability system for department aviation operations and activities; (5) Identify the costs associated with training, education, and the purchase, operation, 171 172 maintenance, and administration of state aircraft assigned to the department and aviation 173 operations and related facilities; (6) In conjunction with the Georgia Aviation Authority, develop an appropriate joint 174 175 billing structure for passenger transportation where the aircraft is designated and operated 176 as a 'civil aircraft' under Part 91 of the Federal Aviation Regulations and charge agencies 177 and other state entities for the full variable hourly costs for the operation of each type of 178 aircraft, evaluated annually and adjusted as necessary based upon the price of fuel, 179 maintenance, and other fees that are a direct result of flying the aircraft on that specific 180 trip; provided, however, that any billing to an agency by the department shall be 181 suspended whenever the Governor declares a state of emergency on any cost associated 182 with aircraft used during and in response to such state of emergency; (7) Retain appropriate external consulting and auditing expertise; 183 184 (8) Engage aviation industry representatives to ensure best practices for department 185 aviation assets; 186 (9) Delegate certain powers pursuant to this article to other state entities; 187 (10) Otherwise implement appropriate and efficient management practices for 188 department aviation operations; and (11) Enter into agreements with the Georgia Aviation Authority for mutual use of state 189 190 airfields and appurtenances, including aircraft hangars." **SECTION 3.** 191 192 Said title is further amended in Part 1 of Article 1 of Chapter 6, relating to the State Forestry 193 Commission, by adding a new Code section to read as follows: 194 ″<u>12-6-25.</u> 195 (a)(1) The commission shall be authorized to acquire, operate, maintain, house, and 196 dispose of all state aviation assets assigned to the commission, to provide aviation 197 services and oversight of such state aircraft and aviation operations for the mission of the 198 commission and legitimate state business purposes, to achieve policy objectives through aviation missions, and to provide for the efficient operation of such state aircraft. 199 200 (2) All aircraft under the custody and control of the Georgia Aviation Authority as of 201 June 30, 2012, which were previously transferred to the authority by the commission and 202 associated parts and equipment and any budgeted operating funds associated with such aircraft shall be transferred on July 1, 2012, back to the custody and control of the 203
- 204 <u>commission.</u>

205 (3) Any persons who as of June 30, 2012, were employed by the Georgia Aviation 206 Authority pursuant to previous transfer from the commission to the authority shall be 207 transferred back to the commission on July 1, 2012, and shall no longer be under the 208 administration or direction of the authority. (4) All airfields and appurtenances, including hangars, previously transferred to the 209 210 Georgia Aviation Authority by the commission and all accounts receivable, budgeted 211 operating funds, other funds, contracts, liabilities, and obligations associated with the aircraft being transferred back to the commission as of July 1, 2012, shall become the 212 213 property, accounts receivable, budgeted operating funds, other funds, contracts, liabilities, 214 and obligations of the commission on such date. 215 (5) The commission shall be responsible for providing aviation services in support of the 216 mission of the commission. The commission shall be authorized to dispose of any state 217 aircraft assigned to the commission and apply the proceeds derived therefrom to the purchase of replacement aviation assets. 218 219 (b) The commission shall have the power to: 220 (1) Hire, organize, and train personnel to operate, maintain, house, purchase, and dispose 221 of aviation assets; 222 (2) Purchase, lease, maintain, develop, and modify facilities to support aviation assets 223 and operations; 224 (3) Develop operating, maintenance, safety, security, training, education, and scheduling 225 standards for commission aviation operations and conduct inspections, audits, and other 226 similar oversight to determine practices and compliance with such standards; 227 (4) Develop an accountability system for commission aviation operations and activities; 228 (5) Identify the costs associated with training, education, and the purchase, operation, 229 maintenance, and administration of state aircraft assigned to the commission and aviation 230 operations and related facilities; 231 (6) In conjunction with the Georgia Aviation Authority, develop an appropriate joint 232 billing structure for passenger transportation where the aircraft is designated and operated as a 'civil aircraft' under Part 91 of the Federal Aviation Regulations and charge agencies 233 and other state entities for the full variable hourly costs for the operation of each type of 234 235 aircraft, evaluated annually and adjusted as necessary based upon the price of fuel, 236 maintenance, and other fees that are a direct result of flying the aircraft on that specific 237 trip; provided, however, that any billing to an agency by the commission shall be suspended whenever the Governor declares a state of emergency on any cost associated 238 239 with aircraft used during and in response to such state of emergency; 240 (7) Retain appropriate external consulting and auditing expertise;

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- (8) Engage aviation industry representatives to ensure best practices for commission
 aviation assets:
 (9) Delegate certain powers pursuant to this article to other state entities;
 (10) Otherwise implement appropriate and efficient management practices for
 commission aviation operations; and
 (11) Enter into agreements with the Georgia Aviation Authority for mutual use of state
 airfields and appurtenances, including aircraft hangars."
