## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Article 1 of Chapter 4 of Title 26 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
- 2 relating to general provisions regarding pharmacists and pharmacies, so as to revise the
- 3 definition of "security paper"; to provide for related matters; to provide an effective date; to
- 4 repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

6	SECTION 1.
7	Article 1 of Chapter 4 of Title 26 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
8	general provisions regarding pharmacists and pharmacies, is amended by revising
9	paragraph (38.5) of Code Section 26-4-5, relating to definitions, as follows:
10	"(38.5) 'Security paper' means:
11	(A) A a prescription pad or paper that has been approved by the board for use and
12	contains the following characteristics:
13	(A)(i) One or more industry recognized features designed to prevent unauthorized
14	copying of a completed or blank prescription form;
15	(B)(ii) One or more industry recognized features designed to prevent the erasure or
16	modification of information written on the prescription form by the practitioner; and
17	(C)(iii) One or more industry recognized features designed to prevent the use of
18	counterfeit prescription forms.
19	Where security paper is in the form of a prescription pad, each pad shall bear an
20	identifying lot number, and each piece of paper in the pad shall be numbered
21	sequentially beginning with the number one; or
22	(B) A prescription pad or paper that has been approved by the Centers for Medicare
23	and Medicaid Services."
