A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Code Section 17-10-1 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to the
- 2 fixing of sentence, suspension or probation of sentence, change in sentence, eligibility for
- 3 parole, prohibited modifications, and exceptions, so as to provide that any convicted person
- 4 who is sentenced to probation shall have such probated sentence demarcated on his or her
- 5 driver's license for the length of his or her sentence; to provide for procedure; to amend
- 6 Chapter 5 of Title 40 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to drivers' licenses,
- 7 so as to provide for license suspension under certain circumstances; to provide for related
- 8 matters; to provide for an effective date; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

10 SECTION 1.

- 11 Code Section 17-10-1, relating to the fixing of sentence, suspension or probation of sentence,
- 12 change in sentence, eligibility for parole, prohibited modifications, and exceptions, is
- amended by adding a new subsection to read as follows:
- 14 "(h)(1) Any person sentenced to probation for a felony offense who has a valid driver's
- license, permit, or identification card shall submit his or her driver's license, permit, or
- identification card to the Department of Driver Services within 20 days of the date that
- the court imposes the probation sentence, or in cases where probation shall follow
- incarceration, within 60 days of having been released from incarceration, in order to have
- a replacement driver's license, permit, or identification card issued.
- 20 (2) The replacement driver's license, permit, or identification card shall be issued with
- 21 <u>a demarcation indicating that such person is serving a probated felony sentence.</u>
- 22 (3) Failure to submit a license, permit, or identification card as required by this
- paragraph, shall result in a suspension pursuant to Code Section 40-5-57.4.
- 24 (4) In the event that the driver's license, permit, or identification card of a person serving
- 25 <u>a felony probation sentence is lost, or for any other reason surrender is impossible, a</u>

26 sworn affidavit indicating his or her inability to surrender the same shall be submitted to

- 27 <u>the department.</u>
- 28 (5) The court imposing such sentence shall notify such person of the provisions of this
- 29 <u>subsection and shall forward a copy of such person's driver's license, permit, or</u>
- 30 <u>identification card to the Department of Driver Services in the same manner and within</u>
- 31 <u>the same time as provided in Code Section 40-5-53.</u>
- 32 (6) This subsection shall not apply to a person sentenced as a first offender pursuant to
- 33 Article 3 of Chapter 8 of Title 42."

34 SECTION 2.

- 35 Chapter 5 of Title 40 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to driver's licenses,
- 36 is amended by adding a new Code section to Article 2, relating to issuance, expiration, and
- 37 renewal of drivers' licenses, to read as follows:
- 38 "<u>40-5-39.</u>
- 39 (a) Any person who has been sentenced to probation for a felony shall be subject to the
- 40 <u>demarcation of his or her driver's license, permit, or identification card during any period</u>
- 41 of probation pursuant to subsection (h) of Code Section 17-10-1 and shall be issued a
- 42 <u>replacement driver's license, permit, or identification card bearing such demarcation upon</u>
- paying a fee of \$25.00. Such license, permit, or identification card shall be issued for the
- 44 remaining period for which the original license, permit, or identification card was issued.
- 45 (b) Renewals of a license, permit, or identification card bearing the probation demarcation
- shall contain such demarcation for so long as the person remains on probation. If the
- 47 <u>person's probation expires or is otherwise completed, or his or her probated sentence is</u>
- 48 overturned before the expiration of the license, permit, or identification card, the person
- 49 may be issued a replacement license, permit, or identification card without such
- demarcation upon receipt of documentation thereof satisfactory to the department and
- 51 payment of a fee of \$25.00.
- 52 (c) In the event such person's driver's license is suspended, revoked, cancelled, or
- 53 otherwise withdrawn as a result of the conviction for which he or she is sentenced to a
- 54 period of probation or for any other reason, including withdrawals in effect prior to such
- 55 person being sentenced to such probation, any permit or identification card issued to such
- 56 person during the period of such withdrawal shall include the probation demarcation.
- 57 (d) The probation demarcation required by this Code section shall be located and designed
- in a manner determined by the department."

- SECTION 3.
- 60 Said chapter is further amended by adding a new Code section to Article 3, relating to
- 61 cancellation, suspension, and revocation of drivers' licenses, to read as follows:
- 62 "<u>40-5-74.1.</u>
- 63 (a) Any person who is sentenced to a period of probation as part of any felony sentence
- 64 who fails to surrender his or her driver's license, permit, or identification card or submit a
- 65 <u>lost license affidavit in accordance with subsection (h) of Code Section 17-10-1 and Code</u>
- 66 Section 40-5-39 shall have his or her license suspended until he or she surrenders such
- 67 <u>license, permit, or identification card, or submits such affidavit.</u>
- (b) Upon receipt of such license, permit, identification card, or lost license affidavit and
- 69 <u>a reinstatement fee of \$60.00, or \$50.00 if paid by mail, the department may issue a</u>
- 70 replacement license, permit, or identification card to such person bearing the probation
- 71 <u>demarcation.</u>"
- 72 SECTION 4.
- 73 This Act shall become effective on January 1, 2013, and shall apply to offenses occurring on
- 74 or after such date.
- 75 SECTION 5.
- 76 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
