

NOTICE OF INTENT TO INTRODUCE LOCAL LEGISLATION

Notice is hereby given that there will be introduced at the regular 2012 session of the General Assembly of Georgia, a bill to amend an Act Providing for the election of the Webster County Chief Magistrate Court Judge and appointment of Assistant Magistrate Judge of Webster county approved April 1, 1996 (Ga. L. 1996, pages 3834 and 3835), as amended, so as to provide that the term of the Assistant Magistrate Court Judge shall be for a period of one-year during the term of the Chief Magistrate, which term shall renew for a subsequent annual term during the term of Chief Magistrate in the absence of thirty (30) days written notice of intent from the Chief Magistrate of intent to not renew such appointment, and for other purposes.

The legislation shall further provide that the governing authority shall not appoint more than one Assistant Magistrate Judge for Webster County.
