A RESOLUTION

- 1 Honoring the life and memory of Mrs. Eunice Hines Adams; and for other purposes.
- 2 WHEREAS, the State of Georgia mourns the loss of one of its most distinguished citizens
3 with the passing of Mrs. Eunice Hines Adams on December 17, 2011; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Mrs. Eunice Hines Adams was born on June 3, 1926, in Whigham, Georgia, a
5 beloved daughter of the late Genie Hadley and Reverend Matthew Hines; and
- 6 WHEREAS, "Peepsie," as she was affectionately called, graduated from Spelman College
7 with a degree in Home Economics in 1947 and did further studies on her Master's degree
8 from the University of Georgia, Wayne State University, and Albany State College; and
- 9 WHEREAS, growing up in a home with a father as a minister, her Christian foundation was
10 forged at an early age; and
- 11 WHEREAS, she was united in marriage to the late John Wesley Adams and later to the late
12 George McBride; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Mrs. Adams was blessed with two remarkable sons, E. Bruce Adams and Brent
14 E. Adams; two wonderful grandchildren, Amari A. Adams and Senetra Frazier; and two
15 adored great-grandchildren, Alexander and Siehera Moody, and
- 16 WHEREAS, she was the interim director of South Georgia Title 20 Program for Youth, a
17 member of the Pride of Bainbridge Chapter 479 Order of the Eastern Star, and director of the
18 Nelson Chapel Day Care Center, where she touched the lives of many young people in
19 Decatur County; and

20 WHEREAS, she gave inspiration to many through her high ideals, morals, and deep concern
21 for her fellow citizens, and the devotion, patience, and understanding she demonstrated to
22 her family and friends were admired by others; and

23 WHEREAS, she was a person of magnanimous strengths with an unimpeachable reputation
24 for integrity, intelligence, fairness, and kindness and, by the example she made of her life,
25 she made this world a better place in which to live; and

26 WHEREAS, a compassionate and generous woman, Mrs. Adams will long be remembered
27 for her love of family and friendship, and this loyal daughter, wife, mother, grandmother,
28 great-grandmother, and friend will be missed by all who had the great fortune of knowing
29 her.
