A RESOLUTION

- 1 Honoring the life and memory of Charles H. Moore, Sr.; and for other purposes.
- 2 WHEREAS, the State of Georgia mourns the loss of one of its most distinguished citizens
3 with the passing of Charles H. Moore, Sr.; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Mr. Moore went missing on October 16, 1943, when he and the other crew
5 members of the "Lucky Star" went down in the Pacific Ocean off of the coast of what is now
6 Papua New Guinea and was declared dead on January 22, 1946; and
- 7 WHEREAS, he served as a guardian of this nation's freedom and liberty with the United
8 States military, valiantly and courageously protecting his fellow Americans during World
9 War II; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Mr. Moore has long been recognized by the citizens of this nation for the vital
11 role that he has played in leadership and his deep personal commitment to the welfare of the
12 citizens of the United States; and
- 13 WHEREAS, he gave inspiration to many through his high ideals, morals, and deep concern
14 for his fellow citizens, and the devotion, patience, and understanding he demonstrated to his
15 family and friends were admired by others; and
- 16 WHEREAS, he was a person of magnanimous strengths with an unimpeachable reputation
17 for integrity, intelligence, fairness, and kindness, and by the example he made of his life, he
18 made this world a better place in which to live; and
- 19 WHEREAS, a compassionate and generous man, Charles H. Moore, Sr., will long be
20 remembered for his love of family and friendship, and this loyal father and friend will be
21 missed by all who had the great fortune of knowing him.

22 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that the members of this body
23 join in honoring the life and memory of Charles H. Moore, Sr., and express their deepest and
24 most sincere regret at his passing.
