13 the Toastmasters Club 5091, the Board of Trustees for the Anchorage, the Board of Directors
14 for Girls Incorporated and the YMCA, the Albany chapter of the Links, Inc., and the

- 16 WHEREAS, she was united in love and marriage to Everette J. Freeman, and was blessed
17 with two remarkable daughters, Mashon Gray and Dara Madzimoyo, and four wonderful
18 grandchildren, Justin II, Jahi, Kachi, and Bailo; and
- 19 WHEREAS, she gave inspiration to many through her high ideals, morals, and deep concern
20 for her fellow citizens, and the devotion, patience, and understanding she demonstrated to
21 her family and friends were admired by others; and

23 for integrity, intelligence, fairness, and kindness and, by the example she made of her life,
