- 2 other purposes.
- 3 WHEREAS, Pastor W.J. Reid was born on July 30, 1936, in Eatonton, Georgia, a beloved
- 4 son of the late Deacon Edmond and Eva Leola Reid; and
- 5 WHEREAS, he accepted his call to ministry at the age of 19, preaching regularly in the
- 6 woods around his home, held his initial sermon at the Jefferson Baptist Church in May of
- 7 1957 under Pastor J.M. Miller, and was licensed to preach by Pastor Miller on January 4,
- 8 1958; and
- 9 WHEREAS, he conducted his first revival at Pinkerton Grove Baptist Church in August of
- 10 1959 and was ordained at Jefferson Baptist Church on December 4, 1960; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Pastor Reid served multiple congregations at once, including Free Gift Baptist
- 12 Church from 1960 to 1991, Plainview Baptist Church from 1962 to 1991, Barrow Grove
- 13 Baptist Church from 1964 to 1991, and Springfield Missionary Baptist Church from 1967
- 14 to the present; and
- 15 WHEREAS, he was employed at Sears Roebuck in Atlanta in 1965, where he worked for 24
- 16 years; and
- 17 WHEREAS, he is the past Moderator of the First Shiloh Missionary Baptist Association and
- 18 currently President of the Morgan County Ministers Union and of the Sunshine Club of
- 19 Dinah Pace Community and Co-Chairperson of the Religious Department of the Morgan
- 20 County Branch NAACP; and
- 21 WHEREAS, Pastor Reid is a member of the Prince Hall Masons, the Morgan County
- 22 Deacon's Co-op, Advisory Board of the Newton County Sheriff, Board of Directors of the

- 30 grandchildren, Rachel, Chasiti, Morgan, and Matthew Reid; and
- 31 WHEREAS, Pastor Reid is a humble servant whose sincere love for God is evident in his
- 32 more than half a century of service and sacrifice to all people, friends and foes alike, who are
- 33 blessed by his personal mantra: "It's just nice to be nice"; and

- of peace and love be recognized and congratulated for his innumerable good works rendered
