- 16 WHEREAS, he served 12 years in the Navy, leaving with the rank of lieutenant and having
- 17 received numerous honors, including an Air Medal and an Antarctic Medal; and
- 18 WHEREAS, after leaving the Navy, he has diligently and conscientiously devoted
- 19 innumerable hours of his time, talents, and energy toward the betterment of his community
- and state as evidenced dramatically by his superlative service with Delta Airlines as a pilot
