### A RESOLUTION

1 Commending the Oliver Morton Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution; and

4 organized on February 22, 1922, by Mrs. Addie Kate Morton Johnson in her home in Gray  
5 in Jones County, Georgia; and

7 Revolution as a sailor and private from Massachusetts under Captains Sampson and  
8 Partridge; and

11 their time to assisting veteran patients, awarding student scholarships, and supporting DAR  
12 schools for the underprivileged; and

14 anniversary of its founding.

15 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that
