A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Article 1 of Chapter 26 of Title 43 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
- 2 relating to registered professional nurses, so as to provide for continuing competency
- 3 requirements as a requirement for license renewal; to provide for inactive licenses; to provide
- 4 for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

6 SECTION 1.

- 7 Article 1 of Chapter 26 of Title 43 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 8 registered professional nurses, is amended by revising Code Section 43-26-9, relating to
- 9 renewal, surrender, failure to renew, and restoration and reissuance of a license, as follows:
- 10 "43-26-9.

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- 11 (a) Licenses issued under this article shall be renewed biennially according to schedules
- and fees approved by the board.
- 13 (b) A renewed license shall be issued to a registered professional nurse or licensed
- undergraduate nurse who remits the required fee and complies with requirements
- established by the board.
- 16 (b.1) Beginning with the 2016 license renewal cycle, an applicant for license renewal
- 17 <u>under this article shall meet one of the following continuing competency requirements</u>
- during the previous licensure period:
- 19 (1) Completion of 30 continuing education hours by a board approved provider;
- 20 (2) Maintenance of certification or recertification by a national certifying body
- 21 <u>recognized by the board;</u>
- 22 (3) Completion of an accredited academic program of study in nursing or a related field,
- 23 <u>as recognized by the board;</u>
- 24 (4) Verification of competency by a health care facility or entity licensed under Chapter
- 25 7 of Title 31 or by a physician's office that is part of a health system and at least 500

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26 hours practiced as evidenced by employer certification on a form approved by the board;

- 27 <u>or</u>
- 28 (5) Other activities as prescribed and approved by the board that show competency in the
- 29 <u>nursing field.</u>
- 30 <u>Failure to meet the minimum continuing competency requirement for renewal of a license</u>
- 31 <u>shall be grounds for denial of a renewal application. The board may waive or modify the</u>
- 32 requirements contained in this subsection in cases of hardship, disability, or illness or under
- 33 <u>such other circumstances as the board, in its discretion, deems appropriate.</u>
- 34 (c) The voluntary surrender of a license or the failure to renew a license by the end of an
- established penalty period shall have the same effect as a revocation of said license, subject
- 36 to reinstatement at the discretion of the board. The board may restore and reissue a license
- and, as a condition thereof, may impose any disciplinary sanction provided by Code
- 38 Section <u>43-1-19 or</u> 43-26-11 or Code Section 43-1-19."

39 SECTION 2.

- 40 Said article is further amended by adding a new Code section to read as follows:
- 41 "43-26-9.1.
- 42 (a) A registered professional nurse, subject to rules of the board and on forms prescribed
- by the board, may request that his or her license be placed on inactive status and to be
- 44 <u>excused from payment of renewal fees until he or she resumes active status.</u>
- 45 (b) A licensee on inactive status may have his or her license restored by submitting an
- 46 application to the board on a form prescribed by the board and paying the required
- 47 <u>restoration fee. The board shall require evidence of competency to resume the practice of</u>
- 48 <u>nursing as a registered professional nurse in order to restore the license to active status.</u>
- 49 (c) A registered professional nurse or advanced practice registered nurse whose license is
- on inactive status shall not practice nursing as a registered professional nurse or an
- 51 <u>advanced practice registered nurse in this state."</u>

52 SECTION 3.

All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
