A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Code Section 3-3-7 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to local
- 2 authorization and regulation of sales of alcoholic beverages on Sunday, so as to provide that
- 3 an election in which the votes cast are for disapproval of Sunday package sales by retailers
- 4 of malt beverages, wine, and distilled spirits shall not nullify the prior election results for
- 5 approval of Sunday package sales by retailers of malt beverages and wine; to provide for
- 6 related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

8 SECTION 1.

- 9 Code Section 3-3-7 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to local authorization
- and regulation of sales of alcoholic beverages on Sunday, is amended by revising paragraph
- 11 (2) of subsection (q) as follows:

- 12 "(2) Any governing authority desiring to permit and regulate package sales by retailers
- of malt beverages, wine, and distilled spirits on Sundays between the hours of 12:30 P.M.
- and 11:30 P.M., pursuant to paragraph (1) of this subsection, shall so provide by proper
- resolution or ordinance specifying the hours during such period when such package sales
- may occur. Upon receipt of the resolution or ordinance, the election superintendent shall
- issue the call for an election for the purpose of submitting the question of Sunday
- that county or municipality for approval or rejection. The election superintendent shall

package sales by retailers of malt beverages, wine, and distilled spirits to the electors of

- issue the call and shall conduct the election on a date and in the manner authorized under
- 21 Code Section 21-2-540. The election superintendent shall cause the date and purpose of
- the election to be published once a week for four weeks immediately preceding the date
- of the election in the official organ of the county. The ballot shall have written or printed
- thereon the words:

'() YES Shall the governing authority of (name of county or municipality) be 25 authorized to permit and regulate package sales by retailers of malt 26 27 () NO beverages, wine, and distilled spirits on Sundays between the hours of 12:30 P.M. and 11:30 P.M.?' 28 29 All persons desiring to vote for approval of package sales by retailers of malt beverages, wine, and distilled spirits on Sundays between the hours of 12:30 P.M. and 11:30 P.M. 30 31 shall vote 'Yes,' and all persons desiring to vote for rejection of package sales by retailers 32 of malt beverages, wine, and distilled spirits on Sundays between the hours of 12:30 P.M. 33 and 11:30 P.M. shall vote 'No.' If more than one-half of the votes cast on the question are for approval of Sunday package sales by retailers of malt beverages, wine, and distilled 34 35 spirits on Sundays between the hours of 12:30 P.M. and 11:30 P.M., the resolution or 36 ordinance approving such Sunday package sales by retailers of malt beverages, wine, and 37 distilled spirits shall become effective upon the date so specified in that resolution or 38 ordinance. If more than one-half of the votes cast on the question are for disapproval of 39 Sunday package sales by retailers of malt beverages, wine, and distilled spirits on 40 Sundays between the hours of 12:30 P.M. and 11:30 P.M., such rejection shall not nullify the prior election results for approval of Sunday package sales by retailers of malt 41 42 beverages and wine on Sundays between the hours of 12:30 P.M. and 11:30 P.M.

borne by the county or municipality in which the election is held. The election

superintendent shall canvass the returns, declare the result of the election, and certify the
