

Senate Resolution 131

A RESOLUTION

1 Recognizing and commending Ms. Dorothy Danley Sparks; and for other purposes.

2 WHEREAS, Dorothy Danley Sparks was born in Fairplay, Georgia, a beloved daughter of
3 Lunie and Frances Bowen Danley at a time when sharecropping was the means of survival
4 for families in the rural South; and

5 WHEREAS, after graduating from R.L. Cousins High School, she attended Clark College
6 of Atlanta, Georgia, where she received a Bachelor of Arts degree in social science with a
7 concentration in behavior science and a minor in secondary education; and

8 WHEREAS, upon completion of college in three and a half years, she returned home and
9 worked as substitute teacher at her former alma mater, R.L. Cousins High School, where she
10 worked until 1967, when the Douglas County School System was totally integrated; and

11 WHEREAS, in 1967, when the federal government abolished the dual school system and
12 required all students to report to the schools in their communities, Ms. Sparks became one
13 of the first African American teachers to integrate Douglas County High School; and

14 WHEREAS, in 1973, Ms. Sparks received a master's degree in education from West Georgia
15 College in Carrollton, Georgia; and

16 WHEREAS, Ms. Sparks's tenure at Douglas County High School extended from 1967 to
17 1995, and she served as the social studies department head for 23 of those 28 years; and

18 WHEREAS, she received the Teacher of the Year award in 1994 and retired in 1995 with 32
19 years of experience; and

20 WHEREAS, Ms. Sparks served on the board of directors for the Douglasville, Douglas
21 County Water and Sewer Authority for ten years, three of which as chairman; and

22 WHEREAS, during her years as an educator, Ms. Sparks and her husband were blessed with
23 two beautiful daughters, Melody Sparks Saffo and Mandy Sparks Johnson, and four
24 remarkable grandchildren; and

25 WHEREAS, a woman of deep and abiding faith, she has been a member of New Mountain
26 Top Baptist Church in Winston, Georgia, for over 50 years where she teaches an adult bible
27 class and serves on various committees; and

28 WHEREAS, it is abundantly fitting and proper that the accomplishments of this remarkable
29 Georgian be commemorated as a testament to the power of one passionate educator to inspire
30 and enlighten countless young minds.

31 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that the members of this body
32 commend Ms. Dorothy Danley Sparks for her commitment to teaching, recognize the impact
33 of her dedication to elevating the minds of her students over her impressive career, and wish
34 her many years of health and happiness.
