A RESOLUTION

1 Recognizing and commending Georgie Hall Danley for her significant accomplishments; and
2 for other purposes.

3 WHEREAS, Georgie Hall Danley is an outstanding individual and has long been recognized
4 as a dedicated public servant with a deep personal commitment to helping others fulfill their
5 purpose; and

6 WHEREAS, Georgie Hall Danley was one of seven children born in Terrell County,
7 Georgia, to the late Manuel John and Bertha Hall, who owned 113 acres of farmland where
8 she was required to work after school until sunset; and

9 WHEREAS, her parents were involved in civil rights, and her mother became the first
10 African American to become a registered voter in their county; and

11 WHEREAS, her parents believed in the importance of a good education and sent all seven
12 of their children to college, and Georgie Hall Danley received a Bachelor of Science degree
13 in mathematics from Paine College and a master's degree in mathematics from the University
14 of West Georgia; and

15 WHEREAS, she went on to do her first year of teaching during the first year that Douglas
16 County integrated their tenth through twelfth grade classes, which turned out to be one of the
17 most difficult years in her teaching experience; and she also taught math at Lithia Springs
18 High School, Alexander High School, and Chapel Hill High School; and

19 WHEREAS, during her teaching career, this distinguish citizen was the Beta Club sponsor
20 and freshman basketball coach at Alexander High School; and she received numerous
21 awards, such as Teacher of the Semester at Alexander High School, the Atlanta Brave's
22 Excellence in Education Award, and STAR Teacher of the Year; and

23 WHEREAS, since her retirement, Georgie Hall Danley continues to be actively involved in
24 her church by teaching Sunday School and ushering and to her community by tutoring young
25 people in math; and

26 WHEREAS, she is married to the love of her life, Leonard Danley, Sr., the first African
27 American Magistrate Judge in Douglas County, and they have three beloved children, Hope
28 Hall, Leonard, Jr., and Leigh Danley McMutry; and

29 WHEREAS, it is abundantly fitting and proper that the outstanding accomplishments of this
30 distinguished Georgian be appropriately recognized.

31 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that the members of this body
32 commend Georgie Hall Danley for her efficient, effective, unselfish, and dedicated public
33 service to the State of Georgia.
