## A RESOLUTION

1 Recognizing and commending dance instructor Mrs. Kaye Williams; and for other purposes.

2 WHEREAS, as a high school student, Mrs. Kaye Williams, recognizing the significance of  
3 dance in the development of personal and interpersonal skills in relation to working  
4 cooperatively with others, began teaching dance with lifelong friend, Mrs. Teda Byus  
5 Brannen; and

6 WHEREAS, Mrs. Williams began her dance teaching career by instructing her aunt's  
7 kindergarten, Kiddie Korral; and

8 WHEREAS, after graduating high school, attending college, marrying, and having a family  
9 and children of her own, Mrs. Williams rediscovered her passion for instructing dance and,  
10 with the help of her sister, Mrs. Gale Wade, and Mrs. Brannen, she began teaching classes  
11 again in her community of Cordele, Georgia; and

12 WHEREAS, Mrs. Williams has devoted 33 years to increasing the community's knowledge  
13 and appreciation of dance and its relationship to human history through her dance classes at  
14 the Cordele Recreation Department; and

15 WHEREAS, she has devoted innumerable hours of her time to painting rooms, installing  
16 full-length mirrors, and decorating the space she shares with other programs of the recreation  
17 department so that her dancers can cultivate skills in a professional and well-equipped  
18 atmosphere; and

19 WHEREAS, studying dance allows students to explore processes of dance construction  
20 through improvisation and organization of movement based on a specific idea, feeling, or  
21 concept in order to develop organizational skills and express meaning through performance;

23 WHEREAS, it is abundantly fitting and proper that the tremendous dedication and  
24 enthusiasm for sharing invaluable historical, cultural, and social skills to the young citizens  
25 of this state demonstrated by Mrs. Kaye Williams be recognized.

26 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that the members of this body  
27 recognize Mrs. Kaye Williams for 33 years of selflessly channeling her passion for dance in  
28 such a way that has greatly benefited the countless students she has taught, commend her for  
29 the innumerable hours she has spent bringing her aspirations to life, and heartily wish her
