A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Article 1 of Chapter 3 of Title 51 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
- 2 relating to general provisions regarding the liability of owners and occupiers of land, so as
- 3 to codify the duty of a possessor of land to a trespasser against harm; to provide for related
- 4 matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

- 7 Article 1 of Chapter 3 of Title 51 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 8 general provisions regarding the liability of owners and occupiers of land, is amended by
- 9 adding a new Code section to read as follows:
- 10 "<u>51-3-3.</u>
- 11 (a) A possessor of land, including an owner, lessee, or other occupant, owes no duty of
- 12 <u>care to a trespasser except to refrain from causing a willful or wanton injury, including by</u>
- 13 <u>a trap or pitfall.</u>
- 14 (b) Notwithstanding subsection (a) of this Code section, a possessor of land may be subject
- to liability for physical injury or death to a child trespasser caused by an artificial condition
- 16 <u>upon such land if</u>:
- 17 (1) The place where the condition exists is one upon which the possessor knows or has
- reason to know that children are likely to trespass;
- 19 (2) The condition is one of which the possessor knows or has reason to know and which
- 20 <u>the possessor realizes or should realize will involve an unreasonable risk of death or</u>
- 21 <u>serious bodily harm to such children;</u>
- 22 (3) The children because of their youth do not discover the condition or realize the risk
- 23 <u>involved in intermeddling with it or in coming within the area made dangerous by it;</u>
- 24 (4) The utility to the possessor of maintaining the condition and the burden of
- 25 <u>eliminating the danger were slight as compared with the risk to children involved; and</u>

(5) The possessor failed to exercise reasonable care to eliminate the danger or otherwise
 protect such children.

- 28 (c) This Code section shall not affect any immunities from or defenses to civil liability
- 29 established by another provision of the Code or available at common law to which a
- 30 possessor of land may be entitled."
