## A RESOLUTION

1 Recognizing and commending the South Hall Republican Club; and for other purposes.

WHEREAS, soon, the first organizational meeting was held in May of 2011 under the name
"the Republican Club at Sterling on the Lake," and the original board consisted of president
Ed Asbridge, first vice president Ken Russell, second vice president Ed Martin, secretary
Wally Stiving, treasurer Michael Clement, and special events coordinator Roger Hendler;

- WHEREAS, during the first meeting, held on July 20, 2011, they added 15 new members
  and had reports from Hall County Commissioner Craig Lutz and Flowery Branch Mayor
  Mike Miller, and Senator Butch Miller was in attendance as a guest speaker; and
- 19 WHEREAS, as they began growing, the Club decided to move their meetings to the Spout
- 20 Springs Library in September of 2011, adding 13 new members; and

- 21 WHEREAS, they decided to open the meeting to the public, and in December of 2011, the
- 22 board of directors changed the name to the South Hall Republican Club, which was made
- 23 effective in January of 2012; and
- 24 WHEREAS, the club grew quickly in 2012, and now has 114 members on its roll; and the
- 25 current leadership includes president Ed Asbridge, vice president Roger Hendler, vice
- 26 president Wally Stiving, treasurer Gordon Grass, secretary Alice Grass, and director Jason
- 27 Covert; and
- 28 WHEREAS, the South Hall Republican Club has served South Hall County by having both
- 29 interesting and educational meetings, and it is abundantly fitting and proper that the they be
- 30 recognized.
- 31 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that the members of this body
- 32 join in recognizing and commending the South Hall Republican Club.
