A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

To amend Chapter 26 of Title 43 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to 1 2 nurses, so as to reconstitute the Georgia Board of Nursing; to provide for membership; to 3 provide for appointment of members; to define a certain term; to repeal the Georgia Board 4 of Examiners of Licensed Practical Nurses; to provide effective dates; to repeal conflicting 5 laws; and for other purposes. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA: 6 7 **SECTION 1.** 8 Chapter 26 of Title 43 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to nurses, is 9 amended by revising Code Section 43-26-4, relating to the Georgia Board of Nursing, 10 membership, meetings, and officers, as follows: 11 ″43-26-4. 12 (a) The Georgia Board of Nursing existing immediately prior to April 4, 1990 July 1, 13 2014, is continued in existence and shall continue to consist of eight members to be 14 appointed by the Governor with the confirmation of the Senate be constituted as provided 15 in this Code section. Those persons serving as members of the board immediately prior to July 1, 2014, shall continue to serve out their respective terms of office and until their 16 successors are appointed. Members shall serve three-year terms and until their successors 17 18 are duly appointed and qualified. Those persons serving as members of the board 19 immediately prior to April 4, 1990, shall continue to serve out their respective terms of 20 office and until their respective successors are appointed and qualified. No member shall 21 be appointed to more than two consecutive full terms, and for purposes of this limitation, 22 an appointment to fill a vacancy for an unexpired term of two or more years shall constitute an appointment for a full term. 23 (b) A vacancy on the board for any reason other than expiration of the term shall be filled 24 for the remainder of the unexpired term by appointment of the Governor with the 25 confirmation of the Senate. In the event a board member changes employment which 26

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27 causes a conflict with this Code section, the position of the member making such change
 28 shall be immediately vacant and a new member appointed to fill the vacancy.

- 29 (c) Each of seven members appointed to the board shall be a registered professional nurse; 30 shall have practiced nursing as a registered professional nurse for at least five years since graduation and immediately prior to appointment; shall be engaged in paid employment in 31 32 clinical, educational, or administrative positions, or any combination thereof; shall be a 33 citizen of the United States; and a resident of Georgia. The eighth member shall be a 34 consumer member appointed by the Governor. The 13 members of the board shall be 35 appointed by the Governor with the confirmation of the Senate and shall consist of two 36 registered nursing educators, one practical nursing educator, two registered nurses 37 employed in nursing service administration, one registered nurse employed in nursing 38 home administration or nursing service administration, two advanced practice registered
- 39 <u>nurses, one additional registered nurse, three licensed practical nurses, and one consumer</u>
 40 <u>member.</u>

41 (d) No fewer than two members of the board shall hold master's or doctoral degrees or

42 both. No fewer than two members of the board shall be currently employed in nursing service administration. No fewer than two members of the board shall be currently 43 44 employed in professional nursing education. No two members of the board shall be 45 employed by the same private school, school within the University System of Georgia, private employer, agency of state government, or another public employer. In the event 46 47 a board member changes employment which causes a conflict with this subsection, the position of the member making such change shall be immediately vacant and a new 48 49 member appointed to fill the vacancy.

50 (e) The board shall meet annually and shall elect from its members a president, vice

51 president, and other officers as deemed necessary. All officers shall serve for terms of one

52 year and until their successors have been elected. The board may hold such other meetings

53 during the year as necessary to transact its business."

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SECTION 2.

Said chapter is further amended by revising Code Section 43-26-5, relating to general powers
of the Georgia Board of Nursing, as follows:

57 *"*43-26-5.

58 (a) The board shall:

59 (1) Be responsible for the enforcement of the provisions of this article <u>chapter</u> and shall

60 be specifically granted all of the necessary duties, powers, and authority to carry out this

61 responsibility;

62 (2) Be authorized to draft, adopt, amend, repeal, and enforce such rules as it deems 63 necessary for the administration and enforcement of this article chapter in the protection 64 of public health, safety, and welfare; 65 (3) Enforce qualifications for licensure <u>under this article or Article 2 of this chapter;</u> (4) Develop and enforce reasonable and uniform standards for nursing education and 66 nursing practice; 67 68 (5) Periodically evaluate nursing education programs and approve such programs as meet 69 the board's requirements; 70 (6) Deny or withdraw approval from noncompliant nursing education programs; 71 (7) License duly qualified applicants <u>under this article or Article 2 of this chapter</u> by 72 examination, endorsement, or reinstatement; 73 (8) Be authorized to issue temporary permits; 74 (9) Renew licenses of registered professional nurses and, licensed undergraduate nurses, 75 and licensed practical nurses in accordance with this article or Article 2 of this chapter; 76 (10) Be authorized to set standards for competency of licensees under this article or 77 <u>Article 2 of this chapter</u> continuing in or returning to practice; 78 (11) Set standards for and regulate advanced nursing practice; 79 (12) Be authorized to enact rules and regulations for registered professional nurses in 80 their performing acts under a nurse protocol as authorized in Code Section 43-34-23 and 81 enact rules and regulations for advanced practice registered nurses in performing acts as 82 authorized in Code Section 43-34-25; 83 (13) Implement the disciplinary process; 84 (14) Be authorized to issue orders when a license under this article or Article 2 of this chapter is surrendered to the board while a complaint, investigation, or disciplinary action 85 86 against such license is pending; 87 (15) Issue a limited license to practice nursing or licensed practical nursing subject to such terms and conditions as the board may impose; 88 89 (16) Provide consultation and conduct conferences, forums, studies, and research on 90 nursing education and nursing practice; (17) Approve the selection of a qualified person to serve as executive director; 91 92 (18) Be authorized to appoint standing or ad hoc committees as necessary to inform and 93 make recommendations to the board about issues and concerns and to facilitate communication amongst the board, licensees under this article or Article 2 of this chapter, 94 95 and the community; (19) Maintain membership in the national organization which develops and regulates the 96 97 nursing licensing examination and the practical nursing licensing examination;

- 98 (20) Be authorized to collect data regarding existing nursing <u>and licensed practical</u>
 99 <u>nursing</u> resources in Georgia and coordinate planning for nursing education and nursing
 100 practice;
 101 (21) Determine fees; and
- 102 (22) Adopt a seal which shall be in the care of the executive director and shall be affixed103 only in such a manner as prescribed by the board.
- (b) The board shall be the sole professional licensing board for determining if a registered
 professional nurse, licensed practical nurse, or any other person has engaged illegally in
- 106 the practice of nursing. If a registered professional nurse <u>or licensed practical nurse</u> is
- 107 charged with the unauthorized practice of any other health profession by any other board,
- 108 such board shall notify the Georgia Board of Nursing before conducting any hearing.
- Nothing contained in this article <u>chapter</u> shall be construed to limit any powers of any other
 board.
- 111 (c) Chapter 1 of this title is expressly adopted and incorporated by reference into this article chapter as if all the provisions of such chapter were included in this article chapter "
- 112 article <u>chapter</u> as if all the provisions of such chapter were included in this article <u>chapter</u>."
- SECTION 3.
 Said chapter is further amended by revising paragraphs (2) and (3) of Code Section 43-26-32,
 relating to definitions, as follows:
- 116 "(2) 'Board' means the Georgia Board of Examiners of Licensed Practical Nurses Nursing
 117 created in Code Section 43-26-34 43-26-4.
- 118 (3) 'Consumer member' means a United States citizen and Georgia resident who is
- 119 knowledgeable about consumer health concerns, does not derive that person's primary
- 120 livelihood from the practice of nursing, and shall neither be nor ever have been a health
- 121 care provider or enrolled in any health related educational program. <u>Reserved.</u>"
- 122 SECTION 4.

Said chapter is further amended by revising Code Section 43-26-34, relating to the board of examiners created, appointment of members, terms, filling of vacancies, meetings, and reimbursement of expenses, as follows:

- 126 "43-26-34.
- (a) The Georgia Board of Examiners of Licensed Practical Nurses shall consist of seven
 members appointed by the Governor. The members in office on July 1, 1992, shall serve
 out the remainder of their respective terms and until their successors are appointed and
 qualified. Members shall serve a three-year term and until their successors are duly
 appointed and qualified. No member shall be appointed to more than two consecutive full

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terms and, for the purpose of this limitation, an appointment to fill a vacancy for an
unexpired term which exceeds two full years shall constitute an appointment for a full term.
(b) A vacancy on the board for any reason other than expiration of the term shall be filled
for the remainder of the unexpired term by appointment of the Governor. Vacancies shall
be filled in a timely manner.

137 (c) Each of the seven members appointed to the board shall be a citizen of the United 138 States and a resident of Georgia. One member shall be a registered professional nurse who is currently engaged in practical nurse education and has been a graduate of an accredited 139 140 or approved school of nursing for a minimum of five years. One member shall be a nurse currently serving in an administrative position in a hospital or nursing home and who is a 141 graduate of an accredited or approved nursing program. One member shall be a consumer. 142 The remaining four members shall be licensed practical nurses and graduates of an 143 accredited or approved school of practical nursing. All members except the consumer shall 144 145 have a current license in good standing, at least three years' experience in nursing, and shall be currently employed in the health care delivery system. In order to have equal 146 representation of the board members, consideration in selection should be given for 147 geographical location and areas of specialty. 148 149 (d) No two members of the current board shall be employed by the same private school, 150 school within the Technical College System of Georgia, private employer, agency of state 151 government, or other public employer. In the event a board member changes employment

152 which causes a conflict defined by this subsection, the position of the member making the

153 change shall be immediately vacant and a new member appointed to fill the vacancy.

154 (e) The board shall meet a minimum of six times a year and may have called meetings

- 155 upon notice issued by its chairman.
- 156 (f) The members of the board shall be reimbursed as provided for in subsection (f) of Code
- 157 Section 43-1-2. <u>Reserved.</u>"

159 Said chapter is further amended by amending Code Section 43-26-35, relating to the duties

SECTION 5.

160 of the Georgia Board of Examiners of Licensed Practical Nurses, as follows:

161 *"*43-26-35.

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162 The board shall:

- 163 (1) Be responsible for the enforcement of the provisions of this article and shall be
- specifically granted all of the necessary duties, powers, and authority to carry out this
- 165 responsibility;

- 166 (2) Be authorized to draft, adopt, amend, repeal, and enforce such rules as it deems 167 necessary for the administration and enforcement of this article in the protection of the public health, safety, and welfare; 168 169 (3) License duly qualified applicants by examination, endorsement, or reinstatement; 170 (4) Enforce qualifications for licensure; 171 (5) Be authorized to set standards for competency of licensees continuing in or returning 172 to practice; (6) Be authorized to enact rules and regulations for licensed practical nurses as they 173 174 apply to the practice of practical nursing; (7) Be authorized to issue temporary permits; 175 (8) Renew licenses of licensed practical nurses in accordance with this article; 176 177 (9) Develop and enforce reasonable and uniform standards for practical nurse education 178 and practical nurse practice; (10) Periodically evaluate practical nurse education programs and approve such 179 180 programs as meeting the board's requirements; (11) Deny or withdraw approval from noncompliant practical nurse education programs; 181 (12) Implement the disciplinary process; 182 183 (13) Be authorized to issue orders when a license is surrendered to the board while a 184 complaint, investigation, or disciplinary act against such license is pending; (14) Issue a limited license to practice practical nursing subject to such terms and 185 186 conditions as the board may impose; 187 (15) Provide consultation and conduct conferences, forums, studies, and research on 188 practical nurse education and practical nurse practice; 189 (16) Be authorized to appoint standing or ad hoc committees as necessary to inform and 190 make recommendations to the board about issues and concerns and to facilitate 191 communication among the board, licensees, and the community; 192 (17) Maintain membership in the national organization which develops and regulates the 193 practical nursing licensing examination; 194 (18) Be authorized to collect data regarding existing licensed practical nursing resources 195 in Georgia and coordinate planning for practical nursing education and practical nursing 196 practice; 197 (19) Determine fees; and 198 (20) Adopt a seal which shall be in the care of the executive director and shall be affixed
 - only in such a manner as prescribed by the board. Reserved." 199

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200	SECTION 6.
201	Said chapter is further amended by revising paragraph (1) of subsection (b) of Code Section
202	43-26-36, relating to application for licensure, examination, and temporary permits, as
203	follows:
204	"(1) The board may issue a temporary permit to applicants for licensure by examination
205	pursuant to paragraph (7) (8) of subsection (a) of Code Section 43-26-35 43-26-5. A
206	temporary permit issued to an applicant for licensure by examination shall be valid from
207	the date of issuance until the first examination scheduled for the applicant is graded and a
208	license is issued. If the applicant does not appear for the examination, the temporary
209	permit is shall automatically become invalid the day of the examination. If the applicant
210	fails the examination, the permit shall automatically become invalid when the examination
211	is graded and may not be reissued."
212	SECTION 7.
213	For purposes of making initial appointments to the reconstituted Georgia Board of Nursing,
214	this Act shall become effective upon its approval by the Governor or upon its becoming law
215	without such approval. For all other purposes, this Act shall become effective on July 1,
216	2014.

SECTION 8.

218 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
