AS PASSED SENATE

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Article 7 of Chapter 4 of Title 49 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
- 2 relating to medical assistance generally, so as to require the Department of Community
- 3 Health to study and identify options for Medicaid reform; to provide for a report on findings
- 4 and recommendations; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other
- 5 purposes.

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

7 SECTION 1.

- 8 Article 7 of Chapter 4 of Title 49 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 9 medical assistance generally, is amended by revising Code Section 49-4-156, which is
- 10 reserved, as follows:
- 11 "49-4-156.
- 12 (a) The board shall examine and identify options for reforming Medicaid in Georgia to
- bring about significant savings to the state, which may include, but not be limited to:
- 14 (1) Enrolling all categories of Medicaid members in managed care programs and
- expanding on the managed care concept by incorporating value based purchasing,
- encouraging the use of medical homes, and increasing focus on prevention, among other
- 17 <u>changes</u>;
- 18 (2) Enrolling some categories of Medicaid members in managed care programs that
- 19 <u>utilize similar measures used by commercial insurers to encourage healthy behavior,</u>
- 20 <u>including copayments, deductibles, health rewards accounts, and incentives; provided,</u>
- 21 <u>however, that this may require a federal waiver; and</u>
- 22 (3) Requiring managed care programs as described in paragraph (1) of this subsection
- 23 <u>to include accountable care organizations and patient centered medical homes in their</u>
- 24 <u>provider networks to improve coordination of care and appropriate use of services.</u>
- 25 (b) No later than December 31, 2013, the board shall provide a report to the Governor,
- 26 Speaker of the House of Representatives, President of the Senate, and each member of the

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- 27 <u>House Committee on Health and Human Services and the Senate Health and Human</u>
- 28 Services Committee on such findings and recommendations. Reserved."

SECTION 2.

30 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
