## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Part 1 of Article 4A of Title 11 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating
- 2 to subject matter and definitions relative to funds transfers, so as to clarify the relationship
- 3 between certain provisions of the Uniform Commercial Code and federal law; to repeal
- 4 conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

## 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

6 SECTION 1.

- 7 Part 1 of Article 4A of Title 11 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to subject
- 8 matter and definitions relative to funds transfers, is amended by revising Code Section
- 9 11-4A-108, relating to the exclusion of consumer transactions governed by federal law, as
- 10 follows:
- 11 "11-4A-108. Exclusion of consumer transactions governed by federal law.
- 12 Relationship to federal Electronic Fund Transfer Act.
- 13 (a) Except as provided in subsection (b) of this Code section, this This article does not
- apply to a funds transfer any part of which is governed by the <u>federal</u> Electronic Fund
- 15 Transfer Act of 1978, 15 U.S.C. Section 1693, et seq., as amended from time to time.
- 16 (b) This article shall apply to a funds transfer that is a remittance transfer as defined in the
- 17 <u>federal Electronic Fund Transfer Act, 15 U.S.C. Section 1693o-1(g), unless the remittance</u>
- transfer is an electronic fund transfer as defined in such act, 15 U.S.C. Section 1693(a).
- 19 (c) In the event of any conflict or inconsistency between the provisions of this article and
- 20 <u>the provisions of the federal Electronic Fund Transfer Act of 1978, 15 U.S.C. Section 1693,</u>
- et seq., such act shall govern and control."

SECTION 2.

23 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
