A RESOLUTION

1 Recognizing and commending Kim Lester, nominee for 2013 Muscogee County School
2 District Teacher of the Year; and for other purposes.

3 WHEREAS, a proper quality education for the young people of this state is the single most
4 important objective of the General Assembly; and

5 WHEREAS, the Muscogee Education Excellence Foundation (MEEF) is a nonprofit
6 organization dedicated to fostering educational excellence by focusing on individual teachers
7 who are innovative and exceptionally effective in their profession; and

8 WHEREAS, the foundation has awarded more than \$1.5 million to teachers through financial
9 incentives in the Teacher of the Year program, the MEEF Grant program, and the MEEF
10 Endowment Fund; and

11 WHEREAS, Janet Davis is chairwoman of the selection committee, which also includes
12 Debbie Caballero, Colby Cardin, Travis Chambers, Debra Everett, Tom Hackett, Paul
13 Hampton, Christine Powell, and Tom Titus; and

14 WHEREAS, nominees are determined by each of the district's schools and will be honored
15 throughout the year, including breakfast with the National Teacher of the Year in March and
16 culminating with the MCSD Teacher of the Year gala on May 2, 2013; and

17 WHEREAS, Kim Lester is a teacher at Britt David Magnet Academy and a nominee for 2013
18 Muscogee County School District Teacher of the Year; and

19 WHEREAS, the devotion to providing the students of Georgia with a quality education
20 demonstrated by Kim Lester is worthy of recognition.

21 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that the members of this body
22 commend heartily Kim Lester as a nominee for 2013 Muscogee County School District
23 Teacher of the Year and express to him their most sincere best wishes for continued success
