## A RESOLUTION

- 1 Honoring the life and memory of Reverend W. Ches Smith III; and for other purposes.
- 2 WHEREAS, the State of Georgia mourns the loss of one of its most distinguished citizens
- 3 with the passing of Reverend W. Ches Smith III on March 2, 2013; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Reverend Smith graduated from the renowned Boys' High School of Atlanta
- 5 and then went on to Mercer University, where he remained for a short while before joining
- 6 the United States Coast Guard; his unit was later fused into the United States Army where
- 7 he spent four years serving as a guardian of this nation's freedom and liberty; and
- 8 WHEREAS, upon leaving the armed forces, Reverend Smith returned to college and received
- 9 his Bachelor of Arts degree from Emory University in 1957, and then he went on to
- 10 Southeastern Baptist Seminary from which he earned his Bachelor of Divinity, Master of
- 11 Theology, and Doctor of Ministry degrees; and
- 12 WHEREAS, a man of deep and abiding faith and the conviction that others should always
- 13 have the opportunity to further their education, Reverend Smith taught ministers on Fridays
- 14 at the Norman Bible Institute for 25 years, served as a trustee of Tift College and Mercer
- 15 University, and originally voiced an idea to create what is now known as the McAfee School
- 16 of Theology in Atlanta; and
- 17 WHEREAS, Reverend Smith served several different pastorates and served as an interim
- 18 pastor of various Baptist churches throughout his life, yet he always retained his deep
- 19 involvement with Tifton Baptist Church, where he served as pastor for 29 years and where,
- 20 upon his retirement in 1995, he was named Pastor Emeritus; and
- 21 WHEREAS, Reverend Smith was united in love and marriage to Mrs. Dorothy Walters
- 22 Smith and was blessed with five remarkable children, William "Skip" Smith IV and his wife
- 23 Judy, Dr. Carol Goff and her husband Rodney, Dr. Karen Smith and her husband Paul, Lisa

24 Daughtrey, and Kathy and Milton Martin; 13 wonderful grandchildren; and nine cherished  
25 great-grandchildren; and

26 WHEREAS, he gave inspiration to many through his high ideals, morals, and deep concern  
27 for his fellow citizens, and the devotion, patience, and understanding he demonstrated to his  
28 family and friends were admired by others; and

29 WHEREAS, a compassionate and generous man, Reverend W. Ches Smith III will long be  
30 remembered for his love of family and friendship, and this loyal servant of the Lord and  
31 friend will be missed by all who had the great fortune of knowing him.

32 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that the members of this body  
33 join in honoring the life and memory of Reverend W. Ches Smith III and express their  
34 deepest and most sincere regret at his passing.
