Senate Resolution 748

A RESOLUTION

1 Recognizing January 17, 2014, as "Community Health Centers Day" at the state capitol; and

2 for other purposes.

WHEREAS, federally qualified community health centers located in over 154 medically underserved communities provide high quality primary and preventive health care to 500,000 people in the State of Georgia, including over 150,000 Medicaid recipients and 225,000 uninsured, the working poor, and a large number of underinsured, elderly, homeless, and other vulnerable populations, without regard to income status, cultural or ethnic heritage, or disease conditions; and

9 WHEREAS, community health centers add \$287 million per year to Georgia's economy
10 through indirect and induced economic activity, including \$125 million in household income
11 and 2,100 Georgia jobs, that saves the Georgia Medicaid program up to 33 percent in annual

12 spending per Medicaid beneficiary; and

WHEREAS, community health centers recruit and retain over 280 health care professionals where they are most needed and offer access to a wide range of cost-effective medical and dental services, behavioral health services, prescription medicines, health education, nutrition counseling, translation services, community outreach, transportation, and other support programs; and

18 WHEREAS, community health centers have a track record spanning four decades of 19 controlling costs, documented in several studies which show that rates of costly emergency 20 room visits, hospitalizations, and specialty care referrals are much lower among health center 21 patients than patients of other providers; and

WHEREAS, community health centers work in partnership with other health care providers,
local hospitals, health departments, social service agencies, and health related support

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- 24 services to maximize resources and assure that services are coordinated to improve the health
- 25 status of the community; and

WHEREAS, community health centers have been innovators in the establishment of patient centered medical homes, providing access to quality care and continuity of care for the

28 patients they serve; and

29 WHEREAS, Georgia's community health centers and their state organization, the Georgia 30 Association for Primary Health Care, have worked diligently to increase the number of 31 community health centers in Georgia and across the nation and have taken a leadership role in establishing more centers in underserved communities to help resolve this state's health 32 33 care access problems, demonstrating commendable efforts in continuous quality 34 improvement, reduction of health disparities among the underserved, the implementation of 35 new health care initiatives such as electronic health records, and utilization of the latest 36 technology to improve both operations and delivery of services to more Georgians; and

WHEREAS, community health centers deserve commendation for their valuable
contributions in expanding access to health care, their outstanding record of service, and their
dedication to improving health care and the health status of all Georgians.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that the members of this body
recognize January 17, 2014, as "Community Health Centers Day" at the state capitol.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Secretary of the Senate is authorized and directed
to transmit an appropriate copy of this resolution to the Georgia Association for Primary
Health Care.
