

House Bill 757

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
AN ACT

1 To amend Article 1 of Chapter 5 of Title 48 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
2 relating to general provisions regarding ad valorem taxation of property, so as to provide that
3 use of certain property for collection and conversion of solar energy shall not constitute a
4 breach of conservation use covenants; to provide for an effective date; to repeal conflicting
5 laws; and for other purposes.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

7 **SECTION 1.**

8 Article 1 of Chapter 5 of Title 48 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
9 general provisions regarding ad valorem taxation of property, is amended by revising
10 subsection (p) of Code Section 48-5-7.4, relating to the assessment of bona fide conservation
11 use property for ad valorem tax purposes, by deleting "or" at the end of paragraph (8), by
12 deleting the period and inserting "; or" at the end of paragraph (9), and by adding a new
13 paragraph to read as follows:

14 "(10) Allowing part of the property subject to the covenant to be used for solar
15 generation of energy and conversion of such energy into heat or electricity. The energy
16 so generated may be consumed on-site or transmitted off-site by the property owner or
17 any other authorized person."

18 **SECTION 2.**

19 Said article is further amended by revising subsection (q) of Code Section 48-5-7.7, relating
20 to the assessment of forest land conservation use property for ad valorem tax purposes, by
21 deleting "or" at the end of paragraph (4), by deleting the period and inserting "; or" at the end
22 of paragraph (5), and by adding a new paragraph to read as follows:

23 "(6) Allowing part of the property subject to the covenant to be used for solar generation
24 of energy and conversion of such energy into heat or electricity. The energy so generated

25 may be consumed on-site or transmitted off-site by the property owner or any other
26 authorized person."

27 **SECTION 3.**

28 This Act shall become effective on January 1, 2015.

29 **SECTION 4.**

30 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
