AS PASSED SENATE

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Article 1 of Chapter 9 of Title 3 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
- 2 relating to the sale of alcoholic beverages by passenger carriers, nonprofit organizations, and
- 3 hotels and motels, so as to provide for the licensing of the production of distilled spirits for
- 4 educational purposes by non-profit museums; to create a definition of non-profit museum;
- 5 to provide a permit fee; to provide limitations of such permits; to waive certain alcohol tax
- 6 and bond requirements for non-profit museums; to provide for related matters; to provide an
- 7 effective date; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

9 **SECTION 1.**

- 10 Article 1 of Chapter 9 of Title 3 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to the
- sale of alcoholic beverages by passenger carriers, nonprofit organizations, and hotels and
- motels, is amended by adding a new Code section to read as follows:
- 13 "3-9-7.
- 14 (a) As used in this article, the term 'non-profit museum' means a museum whose mission
- includes educating the public about the local, state and national history of the United States
- of America, that is owned and operated by a bona fide nonprofit civic organization which
- 17 <u>holds title to improved real property with a structure listed on the National Register of</u>
- 18 <u>Historic Places.</u>
- 19 (b) Notwithstanding any other provision contained in this title or any other law the
- 20 <u>commissioner may issue a permit to produce distilled spirits to a non-profit museum,</u>
- 21 <u>regardless of whether or not such non-profit museum holds an annual license to sell malt</u>
- beverages, wine, or distilled spirits for consumption on the premises, upon the filing of an
- 23 <u>application and payment of an annual fee of \$100.00 by such non-profit museum, provided</u>
- 24 that:

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25 (1) The non-profit museum shall not produce more than 800 liters of distilled spirits each

- 26 <u>calendar year;</u>
- 27 (2) The non-profit museum is located in a county or municipality where the production
- of distilled spirits is authorized; and
- 29 (3) The production of distilled spirits, except as otherwise provided in this code section,
- 30 <u>shall be used for educational purposes only.</u>
- 31 (c) The distilled spirits produced by the non-profit museum may be stored and aged on the
- 32 premises of the non-profit museum only.
- 33 (d) The distilled spirits produced by the non-profit museum may only be used on the
- 34 premises of the non-profit museum and may not be sold or offered for sale by the
- 35 <u>non-profit museum to importers, brokers, producers, wholesalers, retailers, or other retail</u>
- 36 <u>consumption dealers of alcoholic beverages.</u>
- 37 (e) The permit authorized by this code section, authorizes the non-profit museum to
- 38 provide not more than one-half of an ounce as a complimentary sample of the distilled
- 39 spirits produced at the non-profit museum, to a guest who has completed an educational
- 40 <u>tour of the distillery at the non-profit museum and is of legal drinking age provided that the</u>
- 41 <u>non-profit museum may not impose a separate charge for the sample and further provided</u>
- 42 <u>that the non-profit museum shall not provide, directly or indirectly, more than the one</u>
- 43 sample to a guest in one calendar day. Such sample shall be provided in a designated
- 44 <u>tasting area on the premises of the non-profit museum, and all open bottles shall be visible</u>
- 45 <u>at all times.</u>
- 46 (f) The distilled spirits produced by a non-profit museum shall be exempt from the taxes
- 47 <u>imposed by Code Section 3-4-60.</u>
- 48 (g) A non-profit museum shall be exempt from the occupational license tax imposed by
- 49 Code Section 3-4-20 and shall be exempt from the requirement to post a bond as required
- 50 <u>by Code Section 3-4-22."</u>
- 51 SECTION 2.
- 52 This Act shall become effective upon its approval by the Governor or upon its becoming law
- 53 without such approval.
- SECTION 3.
- 55 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
