AS PASSED SENATE

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Title 3 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to alcoholic beverages,
- 2 so as to change the maximum percent by volume of wine to that which is currently allowed
- 3 under federal law; to change the definition of certain terms; to authorize wineries to buy and
- 4 use certain products to manufacture particular types of wine; to provide for related matters;
- 5 to provide for an effective date; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

7	SECTION 1.
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- 8 Title 3 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to alcoholic beverages, is
- 9 amended by revising paragraphs (8), (9), (14), and (24) of Code Section 3-1-2, relating to
- 10 definitions relative to alcoholic beverages, as follows:
- 11 "(8) 'Distilled spirits' means any alcoholic beverage obtained by distillation or containing
- more than 21 24 percent alcohol by volume, including, but not limited to, all fortified
- wines.

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- 14 (9) 'Fortified wine' means any alcoholic beverage containing <u>not</u> more than 21 <u>24</u> percent
- alcohol by volume made from fruits, berries, or grapes either by natural fermentation or
- by natural fermentation with brandy added. The term includes, but is not limited to,
- 17 brandy."
- 18 "(14) 'Manufacturer' means any maker, producer, or bottler of an alcoholic beverage.
- 19 The term also means:
- 20 (A) In the case of distilled spirits, any person engaged in distilling, rectifying, or
- blending any distilled spirits; provided, however, that a vintner that blends wine with
- 22 <u>distilled spirits to produce a fortified wine shall not be considered a manufacturer of</u>
- 23 <u>distilled spirits</u>;
- 24 (B) In the case of malt beverages, any brewer; and
- 25 (C) In the case of wine, any vintner."

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"(24) 'Wine' means any alcoholic beverage containing not more than 21 24 percent 26 27 alcohol by volume made from fruits, berries, or grapes either by natural fermentation or 28 by natural fermentation with brandy added. The term includes, but is not limited to, all 29 sparkling wines, champagnes, combinations of such beverages, vermouths, special natural wines, rectified wines, and like products. The term does not include cooking wine 30 31 mixed with salt or other ingredients so as to render it unfit for human consumption as a 32 beverage. A liquid shall first be deemed to be a wine at that point in the manufacturing process when it conforms to the definition of wine contained in this Code section." 33

SECTION 2.

- 35 Said title is further amended by revising paragraph (1) of Code Section 3-6-1, relating to
- 36 definitions relative to wine, as follows:
- 37 "(1) 'Dessert wine' means a wine having an alcoholic strength of more than 14 percent
- alcohol by volume but not more than 21 24 percent alcohol by volume."
- SECTION 3.
- 40 Said title is further amended by adding a new Code section to read as follows:
- 41 "3-6-21.5.
- 42 A winery may purchase distilled spirits directly from a manufacturer of distilled spirits and
- 43 blend with wine manufactured by the winery to produce fortified wine. Such distilled
- 44 spirits shall not be used by the winery for any other purpose or used to create any other
- 45 <u>type of alcoholic beverage or product."</u>
- 46 SECTION 4.
- 47 Said title is further amended by revising Code Section 3-6-25, relating to wine acquired from
- 48 anyone other than a wholesale dealer authorized to do business declared contraband, as
- 49 follows:
- 50 "3-6-25.
- 51 Any Except as provided in Code Sections 3-6-21.1 through 3-6-21.3 and Code
- 52 <u>Section 3-6-21.5</u>, wine possessed, sold, or offered for sale by a retail dealer which was
- purchased or otherwise acquired from any person other than a wholesale dealer authorized
- to do business under this chapter is declared to be contraband and shall be seized and
- disposed of by the commissioner in the manner provided in this title."
- 56 **SECTION 5.**
- 57 This Act shall become effective upon its approval by the Governor or upon its becoming law
- 58 without such approval.

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59 SECTION 6.

60 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
