## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Article 1 of Chapter 24 of Title 33 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
- 2 relating to general provisions regarding insurance generally, so as to require that a health
- 3 benefit policy that provides coverage for intravenously administered or injected
- 4 chemotherapy for the treatment of cancer shall provide coverage no less favorable for orally
- 5 administered chemotherapy; to provide a short title; to provide for definitions; to provide
- 6 prohibited actions; to provide an effective date; to provide for related matters; to repeal
- 7 conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

## 8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

9 SECTION 1.

10 This Act shall be known and may be cited as the "Cancer Treatment Fairness Act."

11 SECTION 2.

- 12 Article 1 of Chapter 24 of Title 33 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 13 general provisions regarding insurance generally, is amended by adding a new Code section
- 14 to read as follows:

- 16 (a) As used in this Code section, the term:
- 17 (1) 'Cost sharing requirements' includes co-payments, coinsurance, deductibles, and any
- other amounts paid by the covered person for a prescription dispensed by a licensed retail

- 20 (2) 'Health benefit policy' means any individual or group plan, policy, or contract for
- 21 <u>health care services issued, delivered, issued for delivery, executed, or renewed by an</u>
- insurer in this state on or after January 1, 2015. The term 'health benefit policy' does not
- 23 <u>include the following limited benefit insurance policies: accident only, CHAMPUS</u>
- 24 <u>supplement, dental, disability income, fixed indemnity, long-term care, medicare</u>

25 <u>supplement, specified disease, vision, self-insured plans, and nonrenewable individual</u>

- 26 <u>policies written for a period of less than six months.</u>
- 27 (3) 'Insurer' means any person, corporation, or other entity authorized to provide health
- benefit policies under this title.
- 29 (b) A health benefit policy that provides coverage for intravenously administered or
- 30 <u>injected chemotherapy for the treatment of cancer shall provide coverage for orally</u>
- 31 <u>administered chemotherapy for the treatment of cancer on a basis no less favorable than the</u>
- 32 <u>intravenously administered or injected chemotherapy regardless of the formulation or</u>
- 33 <u>benefit category determination by the insurer.</u>
- 34 (c) An insurer providing a health benefit policy and any participating entity through which
- 35 <u>the insurer offers health services shall not:</u>
- 36 (1) Vary the terms of any health benefit policy in effect on December 30, 2014, to avoid
- 37 <u>compliance with this Code section;</u>
- 38 (2) Provide any incentive, including, but not limited to, a monetary incentive, or impose
- 39 <u>treatment limitations to encourage a covered person to accept less than the minimum</u>
- 40 <u>protections available under this Code section;</u>
- 41 (3) Penalize a health care practitioner or reduce or limit the compensation of a health
- 42 <u>care practitioner for recommending or providing services or care to a covered person as</u>
- 43 <u>required under this Code section;</u>
- 44 (4) Provide any incentive, including, but not limited to, a monetary incentive, to induce
- 45 <u>a health care practitioner to provide care or services that do not comply with this Code</u>
- 46 <u>section; or</u>
- 47 (5) Change the classification of any intravenously administered or injected chemotherapy
- 48 <u>treatment or increase the amount of cost sharing applicable to any intravenously</u>
- 49 <u>administered or injected chemotherapy in effect on January 1, 2015, in order to achieve</u>
- 50 compliance with this Code section.
- 51 (d) An insurer that limits the total amount paid by a covered person through all cost
- 52 <u>sharing requirements to no more than \$200.00 per filled prescription for any orally</u>
- 53 <u>administered chemotherapy shall be deemed to be in compliance with this Code section."</u>
- SECTION 4.
- 55 This Act shall become effective on January 1, 2015.
- 56 SECTION 5.
- 57 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
