WHEREAS, Youth Villages, a nonprofit organization that began in Memphis, Tennessee,
in 1986 by Patrick W. Lawler, continues to change children's lives and also serves children,
youth, and their families in Georgia, Alabama, Arkansas, Florida, Indiana, Massachusetts,
Mississippi, New Hampshire, North Carolina, Oregon, Tennessee, and Washington, D.C.;
and

8 WHEREAS, Youth Villages moved to Georgia in 2008 to help with children involved in the 9 *Kenny A* consent decree and specifically to work with vulnerable children and youth who 10 often wind up in state custody; and

WHEREAS, Youth Villages follows its mission, "help children and families livesuccessfully," and the organization adheres to its values; and

WHEREAS, Youth Villages believes that strong families are the answer because they ensure
that each child has a "functioning family and a safe, permanent home" which in turn results
in safer neighborhoods and better communities for everyone; and

WHEREAS, Youth Villages serves children and their families through their Intercept
program in the metro area of Atlanta and psychiatric residential treatment facility, Inner
Harbour, in Douglasville; and

WHEREAS, Youth Villages works with children who receive referrals from Georgia's
Departments of Human Services, Behavioral Health and Developmental Disabilities, and
Juvenile Justice; and

- 22 WHEREAS, Youth Villages also works closely with the Departments of Community Health
- and Education to serve many of these children; and
- WHEREAS, Youth Villages has become a nationally recognized model for working with these vulnerable children, youth, and their families, and as such, the organization has achieved great success with children and youth; and

WHEREAS, Youth Villages uses its Evidentiary Family Restoration model, as well as
evidence-informed services, to achieve successes with the children, youth, and families
which it serves; and

- WHEREAS, Youth Villages maintains data on these children, youth, and their families for two years post-discharge from their program and works with these individuals so that those children and youth do not reenter this state's system or otherwise wind up in this state's court
- 33 systems; and

WHEREAS, Youth Villages is very proud of the assistance it provides to youth aging out of
this state's foster care system through the organization's transitional living program, a
program provided in Georgia through funds donated by Youth Villages's own employees;
and

WHEREAS, it is abundantly fitting and proper that the outstanding accomplishments of this
distinguished organization, its staff, and its volunteers be appropriately recognized for their

40 dedication and work to better the lives of Georgia children, youth, and their families.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that the members of this body recognize February 24, 2014, as Youth Villages Georgia Day at the state capitol, extend a warm greeting to Youth Villages Georgia, its staff, and its volunteers, and convey to them this legislative body's heartiest commendation for their past, present, and future work on behalf of children and youth and their families in this state and throughout our nation.
