A RESOLUTION

1 Recognizing June 20, 2014, as Diabetic Peripheral Neuropathy Alert Day at the state capitol;

2 and for other purposes.

3 WHEREAS, in the United States, it is estimated that 25.8 million people, or 8.3 percent of 4 the total population, are affected by diabetes; and

5 WHEREAS, the American Diabetes Association estimates that over 60 percent of all people 6 with diabetes suffer from diabetic peripheral neuropathy; and

7 WHEREAS, diabetic peripheral neuropathy is a serious condition that damages nerve fibers 8 due to prolonged exposure to high amounts of glucose in the bloodstream; and

9 WHEREAS, diabetic peripheral neuropathy often causes intense pain, frequently described

10 as aching, tingling, burning, and numbress of the feet, which often results in serious foot

11 problems due to nerve damage; and

12 WHEREAS, although it can hurt, diabetic nerve damage can also lessen the ability to feel

13 pain, heat, and cold, which means that diabetic patients may not feel a foot injury or even a

14 stone in their shoe or a nail in their foot; and

WHEREAS, the rate of amputations in people with diabetes is ten times higher than for 15

people without diabetes, and studies show that more than 60 percent of nontraumatic lower 16

17 extremity amputations are due to diabetic peripheral neuropathy; and

WHEREAS, diabetic peripheral neuropathy can occur whether a person has Type I diabetes, 18 19 also known as juvenile diabetes, or Type II diabetes, which is typically adult-onset; and

20 WHEREAS, diabetic peripheral neuropathy accounts for more diabetes related hospitalizations than any other complication; and 21

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- 22 WHEREAS, regular clinical screenings can reduce the burden of diabetic peripheral
- 23 neuropathy; and
- WHEREAS, quality measures, such as those put forth by the Physician Quality ReportingSystem, can ensure that patients are receiving appropriate evaluations needed to prevent
- 26 complications resulting from inadequately managed diabetic peripheral neuropathy; and
- WHEREAS, these kinds of endorsed quality measures should be considered for incorporation
 into new models of healthcare payment and delivery, such as accountable care organizations;

- 30 WHEREAS, it is important that Georgians with diabetes be aware of the dangers and
- 31 warning signs of diabetic peripheral neuropathy and make healthy lifestyle choices to prevent
- 32 the onset of this life-changing condition.

34 the members of this body encourage members of the General Assembly and their constituents

- 35 to partner with the state health department, medical communities, and community-based

- 37 recognize June 20, 2014, as Diabetic Peripheral Neuropathy Alert Day at the state capitol.
