A RESOLUTION

1 Recognizing and commending Dr. Carol E. Dixon in honor of Women's History Month 2014;
2 and for other purposes.

4 from Wayne State University, with certifications by the Institute for Motivational Living and
5 in early childhood development; and

8 Assembly, the Wayne County Commission, and several charitable organizations; and

16 women who have contributed their time and talents to the betterment of this state and nation,
17 and it is abundantly fitting and proper that the outstanding accomplishments of this
18 remarkable Georgian be recognized.
