A RESOLUTION

1 Recognizing and commending Ivy Green in honor of Women's History Month 2014; and for
2 other purposes.

3 WHEREAS, Ivy Green was raised in South Fulton County, Georgia, and attended school in
4 the Georgia Public School System; and

5 WHEREAS, Ms. Green has been on the public service trail since the age of eight, and during
6 her youth, she worked on numerous campaigns and with various organizations, such as the
7 Southern Christian Leadership Conference and the 1988 presidential campaign for Jessie
8 Jackson; and

9 WHEREAS, from 1994-1997, Ms. Green served as the organizer/event coordinator for the
10 Georgia Association of Black Elected Officials as campaign treasurer and campaign manager
11 for six successful campaigns; and

12 WHEREAS, in 2000, she had the distinct honor of serving as a White House intern for the
13 Clinton administration in the office of Vice President Al Gore; she also served under Dr.
14 Lorraine C. Miller, the first African American to serve as Clerk of the United States House
15 of Representatives; and

16 WHEREAS, following the completion of several congressional internships, Ms. Green
17 worked for the National Foundation of Women Legislators as a special assistant to President
18 Robin Read; and

19 WHEREAS, in 2007, she received her license to preach the gospel of Jesus Christ, and in
20 2008, she received the Georgia Women Pioneers award from the National Organization of
21 Black Elected Legislative Women; and

22 WHEREAS, throughout the years, Ms. Green has received numerous accolades for service
23 from community leaders, including the Honorable Maxx Cleland, the Honorable John Lewis,
24 the Honorable Cynthia McKinney, and Geraldine Farrao; and

25 WHEREAS, she is also committed to serving her community and has been involved in
26 countless activities in her church, voter registrations, youth educational programs, summer
27 camps, and food and clothing drives; and

28 WHEREAS, Women's History Month, March, 2014, is set aside to celebrate and honor
29 women who have contributed their time and talents to the betterment of this state and nation,
30 and it is abundantly fitting and proper that the outstanding accomplishments of this
31 remarkable Georgian be recognized.

32 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that
33 the members of this body recognize and commend Ivy Green in honor of Women's History
34 Month 2014 for her extraordinary dedication to protecting and improving the quality of life
35 of her fellow citizens and extend to her their most sincere best wishes for continued success.
